
"I needed that year to myself, just to get everything back in order, and I really enjoyed it," Duffy

By transferring to Nebraska, Duffy is closer to his family, which is important to him.

"My family has always been very supportive," he said. They never missed his junior high and high school races, he said, and at least one member of the family has been at every one of his races for Nebraska. "Out in Illinois," Duffy said, "I didn't have anybody to share it with."

Duffy was recruited for Illinois by present Nebraska cross country coach Jay Dirksen. Dirksen said Duffy is running better at Nebraska.

"He's a hard worker. He's working hard enough so that his goals are becoming a reality. I think he's got his best racing years-ahead of him.


