The center also provides altered The center includes a special com- keyboards, special software that eliminates the need to press two keys simultaneously, and silent lap computers that can travel to class with students who do not have the manual dexterity to hold a pencil.

A voice synthesizer that vocalizes words appearing on the computer screen is available for students who need auditory signals, and a large print monitor will enlarge letters to as much as 5-inches high for visually impaired

The University of Nebraska Foundation provided funds to purchase the specialized computer system, the large print monitor and the portable computers. A computer telephone brings in special information services.


The idea for the new center began two years ago when UNL's specialists in services for the handicapped went to a seminar on computers and the handicapped.

"I was working on a graduate fellowship, feeling really frustrated that kids with disabilities had to drop out because studying took up so much more of their time than it did for other students." said Christy Horn, coordinator for the project. "Then I realized there was a whole world of technology waiting out there to help them."
