

Women's tennis team gets win going into Big 8 meet

The Nebraska women's tennis team ended its regular season with a win Monday.

The Cornhuskers defeated Kansas State 5-4.

Freshman Lisa Hart picked up her 15th win of the season after de-

feating the Wildcats' Dinah Watson 6-3, 6-0.

The Huskers are 8-14 on the year, and they will head into the Big Eight Championships this weekend in Oklahoma City, Okla.

The win over the Wildcats helped the Huskers rebound from a 7-2 loss to Kansas Sunday.

The Huskers will start competition Thursday afternoon against a group that contains defending NCAA champion Utah and Georgia, Michigan, Louisiana State and West Virginia.

All three seniors hope to finish in the top three in their group Thursday and make the finals Friday night.

As seniors, the three hope their last meet lasts as long as it can.

Hawkinson said participating at nationals would be a good cap to her Nebraska career.

"With this being our last meet, I think we all will be leaving with good feelings," Hawkinson said. "We've achieved this year all we wanted to achieve and more."

Now the Huskers will return to a place that may have been a stepping stone for this season — the Georgia Coliseum.

Nebraska finished third at the Bulldog Invitational on March 12 in Athens. Duval said the experience Ne-

braska picked up then would help the team on Thursday.

"It helps a lot when you don't have to go to a gym you've never been to," Duval said. "The equipment was great, so I won't have any problem with that."

Hawkinson agreed. "Being there earlier this season, we're familiar with the gym and the equipment," Hawkinson said. "We had a great meet there, and I think that helps a lot too."

The Huskers scored a then-season-high of 193.25.

Since then, Nebraska has set a school record in each of its last two meets and has eclipsed that 193.25 score four times.

Duval said it would take another great effort for the Huskers to advance to Friday night's finals.

"We need another regional meet, plus there's no way we can afford to fall," Duval said. "We're going to have to improve on our last four meets."

Nebraska coach Angela Beck said Dillavou could have been the odd person out in the Huskers' playing rotation next season because of a strong recruiting class.

"We had conferences at the end of the year, and we talked about her opportunities," Beck said. "I told her she might not be playing a lot next year, and the competition for playing time would be strong."

"She felt it was time for a change."

Nebraska's recruiting class is ranked 14th in the country by Blue Star Basketball Report. The Huskers' class was ranked the best in the Big Eight and includes honorable mention All-American players Kate Benson and Cori McDill.

Dillavou said she would have liked

to stay in Nebraska, but she wanted more playing time.

"Everybody is going to be fighting for minutes next year," Dillavou said. "I decided it was time for me to make a change because I want to play, and I know I'll have a good chance there."

Minnesota-Duluth will be entering its second season as an NCAA Division-II school after moving up from NAIA. Coach Karen Stromme led the Bulldogs to a 20-8 finish last season and a co-championship in the seven-team Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference.

Minnesota-Duluth has won the conference title five of the past seven seasons.

Beck said Dillavou would fit in well with the Bulldogs.

"They want her, and they feel that she can make an impact on their program," Beck said. "Chris feels like she can make a big impact there, too."

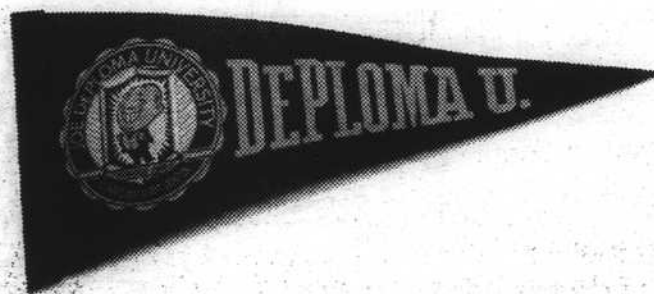
