Mrs. Mattie Soukup and Miss Theresa Harrington went to Lincoln Thursday where they will visit friends for a few days.

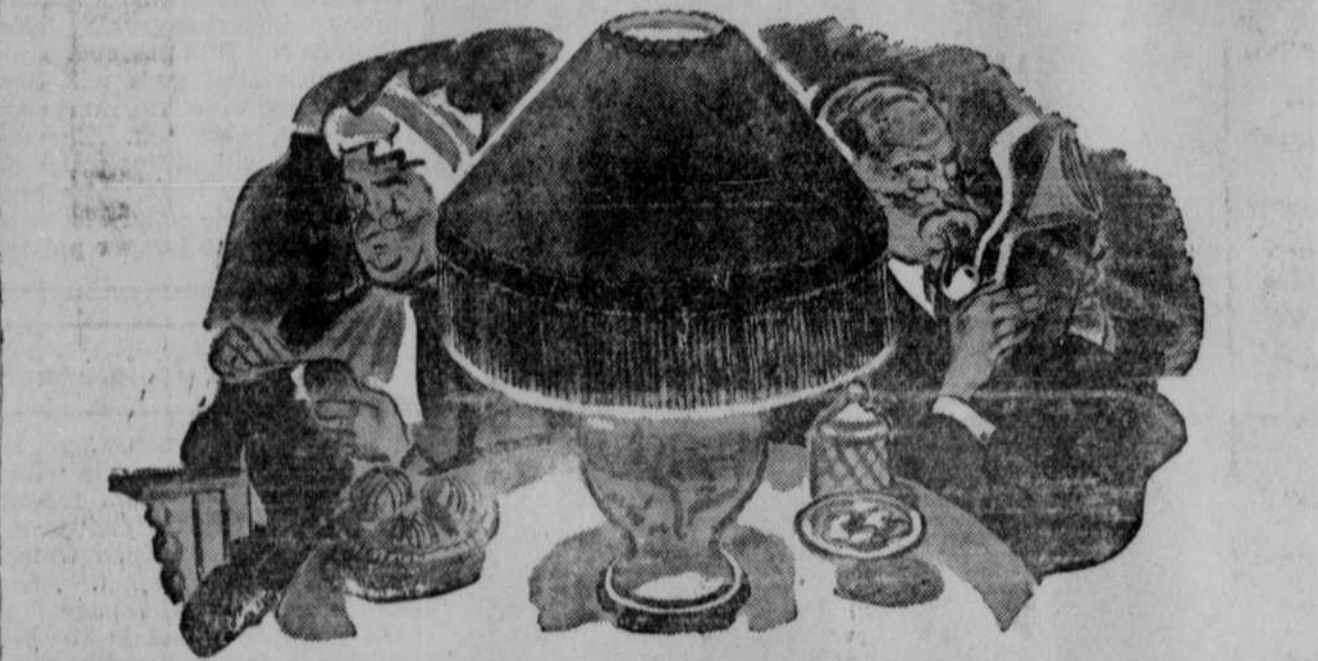
