Repeat layers, using macaroni for top layer. Add salt, pepper and onion to tomatoes. Pour over all. Dot with butter. Cook 25 minutes in moderate oven (350 degrees F.). Sprinkle corn flakes on top. Brown. Serves 6-8.
