Drain and remove pits from prunes. Mix cinnamon and 4 tablespoons sugar. Roll prunes in this mixture until sugar takes up moisture of prunes. Sift flour, baking powder and remaining sugar. Place in mixing bowl. Four cold milk into depression made in dry ingredients. Add molasses, beat until molasses is well incorporated into ingredients. Knead dough on well-floured board, roll quite thin. Cut into strips 4 in. by 2 in. Place prunes on each end of dough strip, roll up and seal ends, leaving sides open. Brush with milk or egg-milk mixture. Bake 15 to 20 minutes—about 400 to 425 degrees. Topping: Melt a few tablespoons powdered sugar with prunes juice (or plain water).
