**BRAVE AVIATOR PORTRAYS
REMARKABLE MOVIE SCENE**

To "Rod" Rogers, famed as a pilot but unknown as a motion picture actor, goes the credit for performing the greatest death scene ever record-

ed on the screen. "Rod" Rogers portrays an American aviator, mortally wounded in a plane shot down in flames from an altitude of 6,000 feet.

The sequence was desired by William Wellman, director of the now famous air epic, "Wings" which will show at the Royal theatre on November 1, 2, and 3.

Taking the plane up through and

above the clouds, facing an electrically driven camera fastened to the front of the cockpit, Rogers cut his flames and deliberately plunged the "ship" into a tail-spin.

When scarcely 1,000 feet above the ground, Rogers suddenly "came to life." He grabbed and pulled the stick, straight out, circled around and made a perfect landing.
