

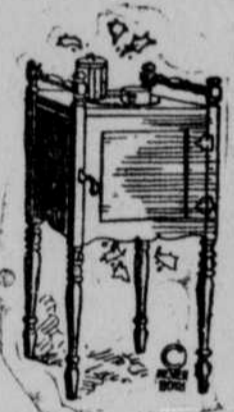
Headquarters For Santa Claus
