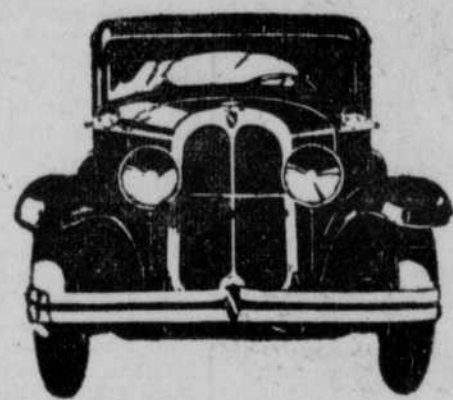

Miss Eunice Hoffman, teacher of District No. 70 reports that they held a box social last month which cleared them \$50.50 from twenty-one boxes.

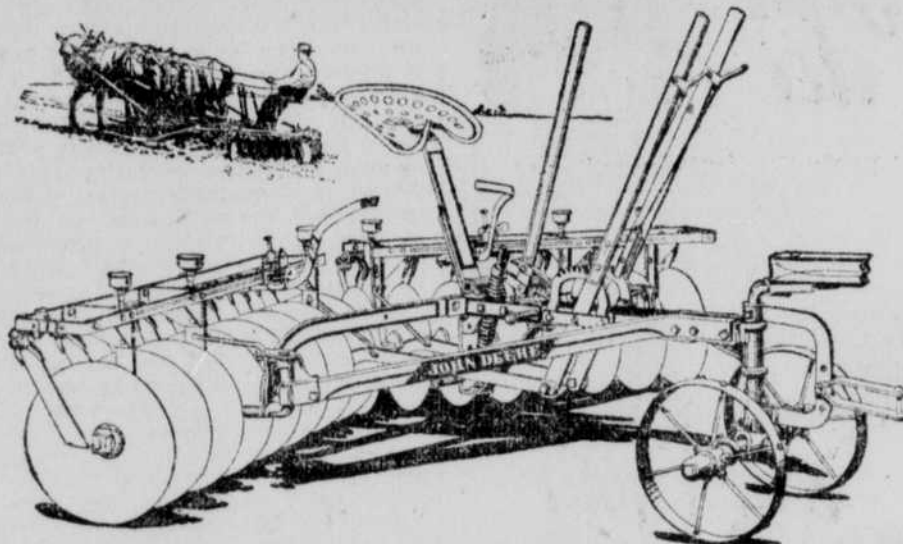
Miss Amelia Saunto, teacher of District No. 208, reports that they have purchased a water jar and fountain, also a clock and supplies for the primary grades from money earned from a box social at Christmas time.

The Pleasantdale Parent-Teacher Association held their regular meeting at District No. 157, Edna McCarthy teacher, last Thursday evening. Miss Mary Grasskamp, the Red Cross Nurse, was present and gave a very interesting talk and demonstrations on the proper procedure for resuscitating victims of water, gas and elec-

tricity. The Normal Training Classes from Ewing and Atkinson are doing observation work and practice teaching in the rural schools of the county this week. The class from the O'Neill Public School will go out next week and the class from St. Mary's Academy will go out the first week in April. It is evident that work in the rural schools where all the problems of a rural community may be met is much more beneficial than practice teaching in the city school where the conditions are ideal. The first two days they observe the work of the regular teacher, the third day they help the teacher with the lower grades and the fourth and fifth day they take full charge of the school.
