Porter, as County Clerk of Holt County, Nebraska, to surrender \$11,000.00 of said bonds and to authorize in writing the Omaha Trust Company of Omaha, Nebraska, the depository for said bonds, to invest the proceeds from the said U. S. Treasury bonds in the said Federal Land Bank bonds and to substitute said Federal Land Bank bonds for the said U. S. Treasury bonds.

Whereas, said bonds have been called for payment as of June 15th, 1929 by the Federal Government, and
Whereas, the said Nebraska State Bank is desirous of disposing of said bonds on the date they are called for payment and reinvesting the proceeds thereof in Federal Bank Bonds of the same grade and value as the treasury bonds above specified, now,
Therefore, I move you that the Omaha Trust Company be, and hereby is, authorized to sell and surrender said \$11,000.00 U. S. Treasury 4 1/2's and to reinvest the proceeds, in the sum of \$11,000.00 in Federal Land Bank bonds, issued by a Land Bank of approved and responsible standing under the following conditions:

3. That upon the investment of said moneys in Federal Land Bank Bonds said Omaha Trust Company will hold said Land Bank Bonds for the protection of the public moneys in the Nebraska State Bank of O'Neill under the terms and conditions of the agreement under which it held said Treasury bonds.
4. That said Omaha Trust Company will at all times have \$11,000.00 either in bonds or money for the protection of public moneys in said Nebraska State Bank.

ORDINANCE NO. 117 A

An ordinance providing for a levy to raise funds by taxation on property situated within the corporate limits of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska, for the fiscal year ending the first Tuesday in May, 1930.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska:

Section 1: That the City of O'Neill, Nebraska, make the following levy for taxes for the fiscal year ending the first Tuesday in May, 1930, on all taxable property within the corporate limits of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska:

For general purposes five mills on the dollar.

For street lighting two mills on the dollar.

For refunding bond interest and sinking fund, one and one-half mills on the dollar.

For support of band one-half mill on the dollar.

Section 2: This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
