Board called to order by the Chairman.
The matter of the unfinished business involving the Agricultural Societies coming on for further consideration, the South Fork Holt coun-

ty Agricultural Society appearing by its officers and attorney, and the Holt County Agricultural Society appearing by its officers and attorney, motion was thereupon made by Gibson that the appropriation for County Fairs be divided equally between the Holt County Agricultural Society and the South Fork Holt County Agricultural Society. The motion was lost for the want of a second.

It was thereupon moved by Stein and seconded by McKim, that the Board appropriate \$3,000 to the Holt County Agricultural Society. Aye and may vote being called for, resulted as follows: Stein, Yes; Steinhauser, Yes; McKim, Yes; Gibson, No; Skidmore, not voting; James, No; Sullivan, Yes.

Motion was thereupon duly declared carried. To which motion the South Fork Holt County Agricultural Society duly excepted.

It was thereupon moved by Stein and seconded by Steinhauser that the application of the South Fork Holt County Agricultural Society for a portion of the appropriation and levy be denied. Upon the above motion being put to a vote by the Chairman, it was duly carried. Thereupon the South Fork Holt County Agricultural Society duly excepted.

The South Fork Holt County Agricultural Society asked for an order allowing a bill of exceptions which request was granted, and forty days from the adjournment of the meeting is allowed the applicant to prepare, file and serve bill of exceptions.

The applicant, South Fork Agricultural Society, thereupon moved the County Board for an order allowing and fixing the amount of the supercedas bond. On motion of McKim, seconded by Stein, the application for the supercedas bond and order fixing the amount thereof was denied to which the South Fork Holt County Agricultural Society duly excepted.
