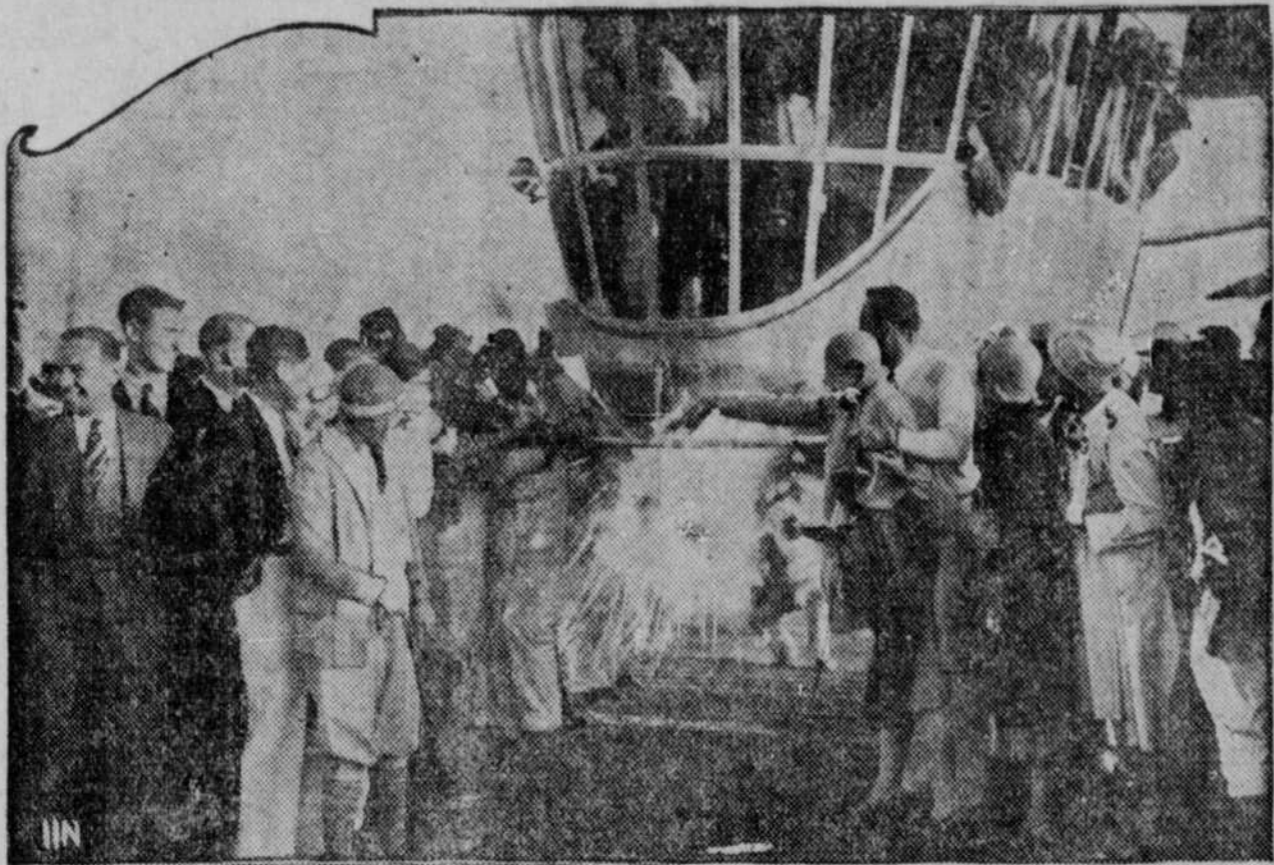


Amelia Christens Our Giant "Zep"

Didn't Rehearse



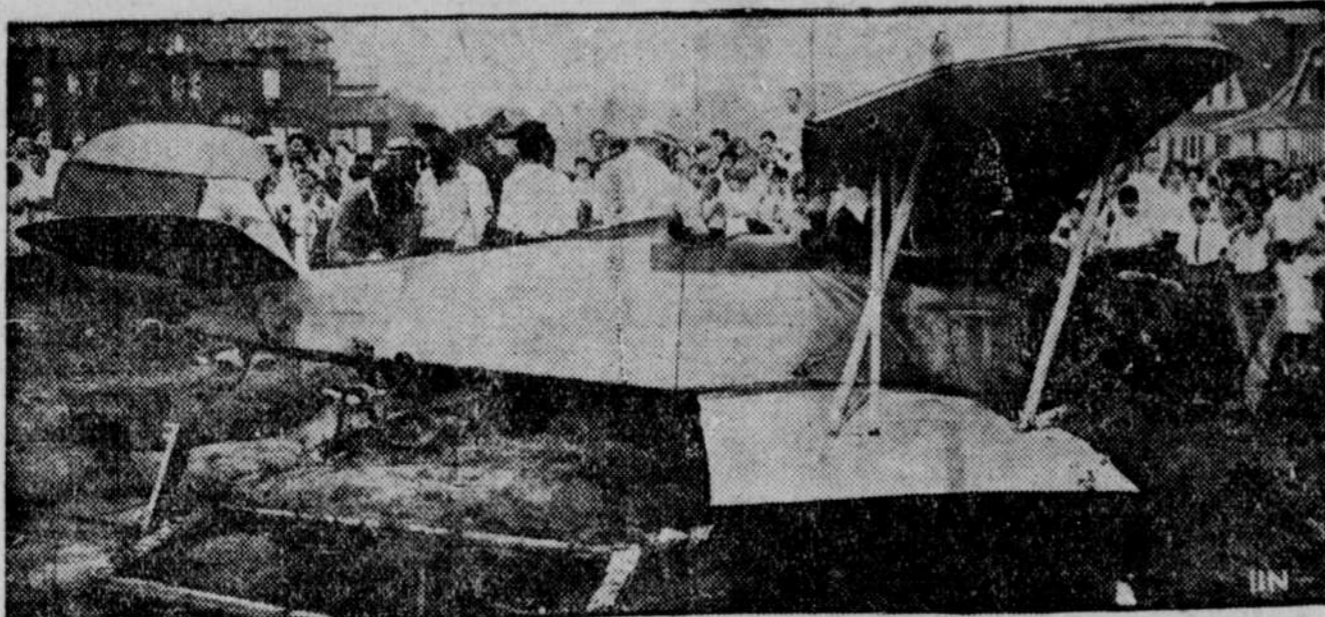

Doctor Held



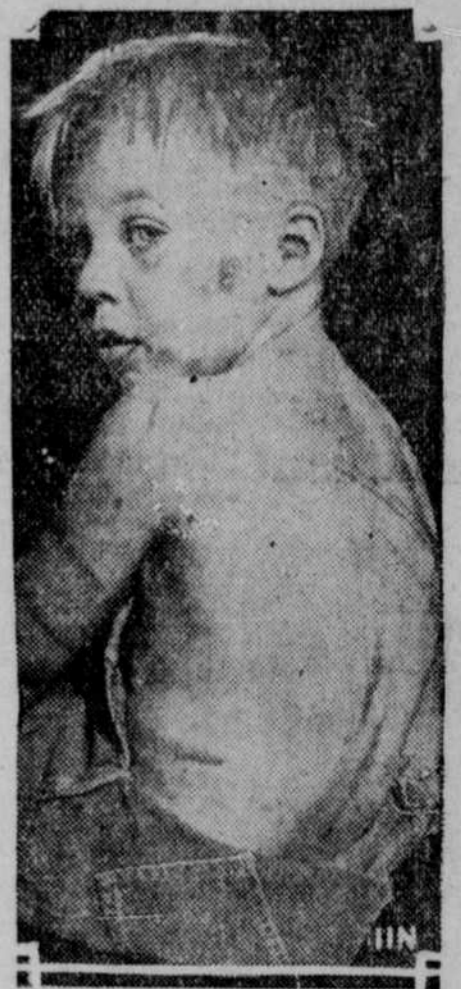
