

Scofflaw Cycles.

After an absence of 301 years a Dawes has ventured back to the ansestral nursery at Sidbury, England. He was greeted with smiles, flags and speeches of welcome. One of the earlier Daweses would more than likely have been met with a warcant for his arrest.

Rare Old Tapestry Acquired by Boston

BOSTON- - A rare 15th century Gothic tapestry has been acquired by the Boston Museum of Fine Arts by glft from Robert Treat Paine II.

While abroad this summer, Mr. Paine purchased the tapestry from Knole House in Kent, considered the most nearly perfect surviving example of domestic architecture of Tudor, England.

For more than 400 years the great tapestry hung in the chapel of this famous baronial residence, having been presented Knole early in the 16th century by Archbishop Wareham, then its owner.

The tapestry, 29 feet long and 13 feet high, was woven about 1490, possibly for a cathedral. In it are represented six scenes depicting the trials and suffering of Christ at the hands of Pilate, Heriod and the populace from 4:30 a. m., to 7:30 a. m., on the day of the crucifixion.

That the tapestry is from the hand of a very great designer is said to be obvious from the drawing and arrangement of the several parts as well as from the splendid unified ensemble. While the artist is as yet unidentified, a clue exists in the similarity of the design of this tapestry and the more fragmentary Passion tapestry of St. Maurice, Angers, which is attributed to the much discussed designer, Jean van Roome, and the no less celebrated Brussels weaver, Pieter van Aelst.

peals, he who purchases inquor from an illicit dealer has committed no offense under the Eighteenth amendment and the Volstead act, Eighteenth even though the dealer who sold it to him is adjudged guilty of a crime and sent to prison. In the case before this court the person convicted of selling the liquor was sentenced by a federal district court to 15 months' imprisonment and a fine of \$20,000, and the buyer, who admitted his part in the transac-tion, was fined \$200. On appeal, the decision, so far as it applied to the buyer, was reversed, with the ap-pellate justices ruling that the purchaser is not an abettor of the offense within the meaning of the statute.

This decision, of course, is subject to review by the supreme court, but as it stands it makes the Volstead

act anomalous among criminal statutes. Action which would make an individual an accessory or a participant in the case of ordinary offenses is stamped as perfectly le-gitimate where the federal prohi-bition statute is involved. The sale of liquor, which the law makes a crime, is obviously a two-sided transaction. Without the co-operation of two persons no crime can be committed, but all the wrongdoing, according to this interpretation, is on one side.

That may be good law as the statute now stands, but the lay mind will hardly be convinced that it is equally good ethics. If congress wishes to strengthen the legal machinery of enforcement it need not wait for a final ruling upon this point by the supreme court; it can amend the statute at once so that its purport is plain. But is congress really so earnest about enforcement as to declare unequivocally that he who aids a bootlegger by buying a drink shall be fined or sent to jail?




