

# Air Route to South America Is Established by Colombian Treaty

WASHINGTONof a reciprocal agreement between the United States and Columbia, permitting commercial airplanes of each country to fly over the other's territory, shattered the last official barrier to the extension of the Miami-Panama airmail route to Santiago, Chile.

Extension of the airmail route, for which contracts have been awarded Pan Amercian Airways, Inc., will set up one of the longest and most hazardous commercial air lines in the world.

It will make possible transportation of mail from New York, Chicago, Washington and other centers in the United States to the principal cities of Colombia, Ecuador. Peru and Chile within a few days instead of weeks and months now consumed in shipping mail and


