ORDINANCE NO. 118A.

An ordinance to amend Section 1 of Ordinance No. 78 A of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska and to repeal said

Section 1 of Ordinance No. 78 A as it now exists.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF O'NEILL, NEBRASKA.

Section 1. That Section 1 of Ordinance No. 78 A of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska be, and it is, amended to read as follows:

"Section 1. The following shall be the established tariff or charge for water furnished by the water works system owned by the City of O'Neill to consumers of water obtained from such system. The water rates shall be as follows: For the first 10,000 gallons or fraction thereof each quarter the sum of Three Dollars; for the next 40,000 gallons each quarter 25 cents per 1,000 gallons; for the next 150,000 gallons each quarter 20 cents per 1,000 gallons; for the next 100,000 gallons each quarter, 18 cents per 1,000 gallons. Provided, however, that if any consumer shall use more than 300,000 and less than 400,000 gallons in any one quarter the rate for water shall be 17 cents per 1,000 gallons for the entire amount so used and no more. And provided further that if any consumer shall use more than 400,000 gallons in any one quarter the rate for water shall be 15 cents per 1,000 gallons for the entire amount so used, and no more."

Section 2. That Section 1 of Ordinance No. 78 A as it now exists be, and it is, repealed.
