Workmen repairing its axle, which had collapsed, discovered that the wheel had been running for 115 years, says Popular Science Monthly. 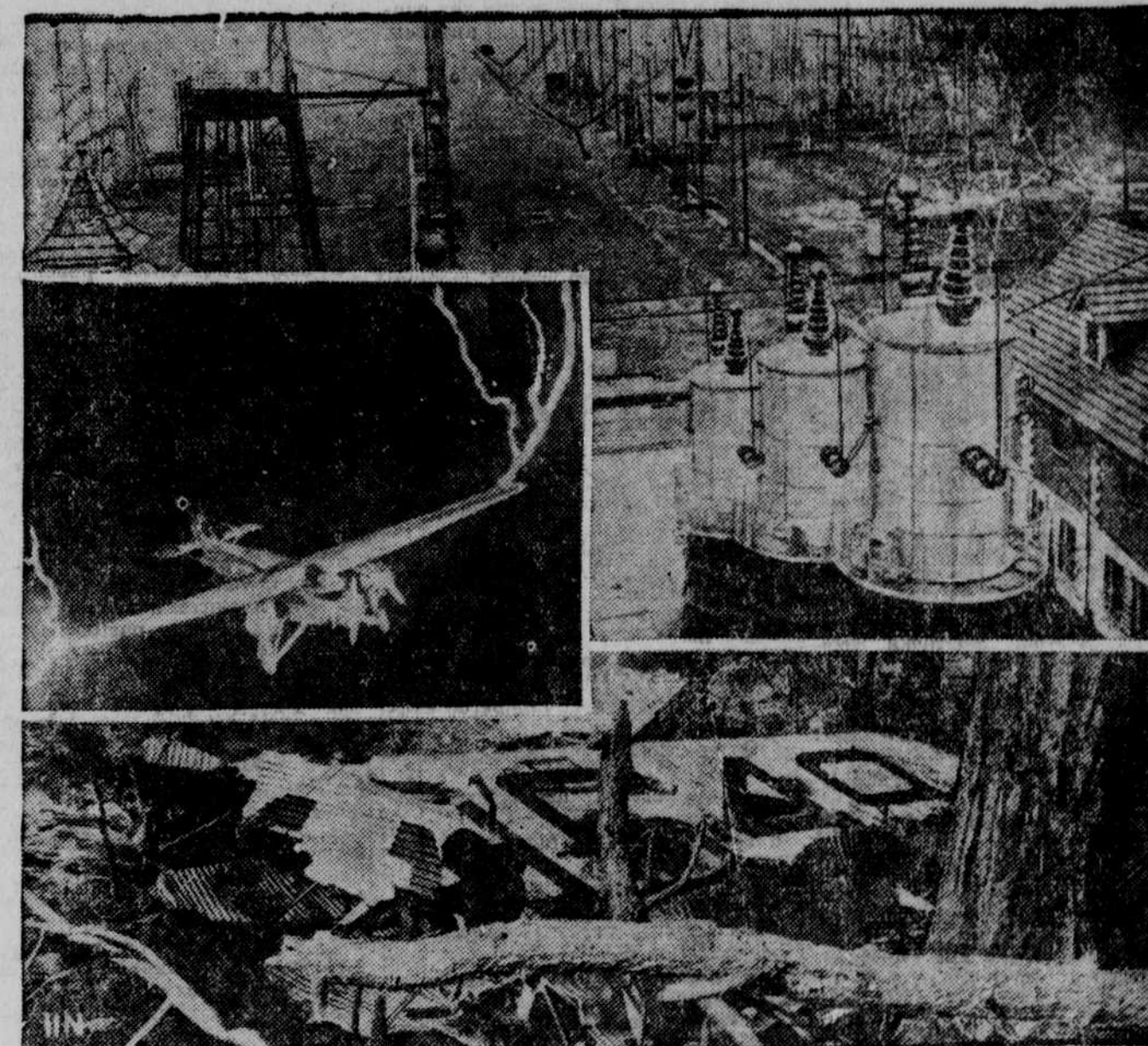

**Science Creates Lightning Bolts to Protect Aircraft**



Lightning is manufactured at this "Lightning Farm" at Barberton, Ohio, for the purpose of testing the immunity of various types of aircraft. Above is depicted a bolt of manufactured lightning striking an exact model of a transport plane, to determine the path that a real bolt would make through the ship. Below is the wreck of a transcontinental plane supposedly struck by lightning during a recent storm.

SOMETIMES lightning does strike twice in the same place. One of these places is at the "Lightning Farm," located at Barberton, Ohio, where lightning is manufactured for several experimental purposes.

In times such as this it is easy to suggest some drastic remedy that is sure to cure a particular evil, but in curing one evil the remedy may create two or three new ones. Such a suggestion is made by Senator Carter Glass for increasing the membership and strengthening the structure of the federal reserve system.

Senator Glass would make membership in the system attractive to banks by making it profitable. He would amend the federal reserve act to provide that 25 per cent of the profits of the federal reserve banks go to the government as a franchise tax; that 25 per cent to be retained by the banks until surplus is equal to subscribed capital;

**DOCUMENTS CORRECT ERROR CONCERNING NATIONAL ANTHEM**

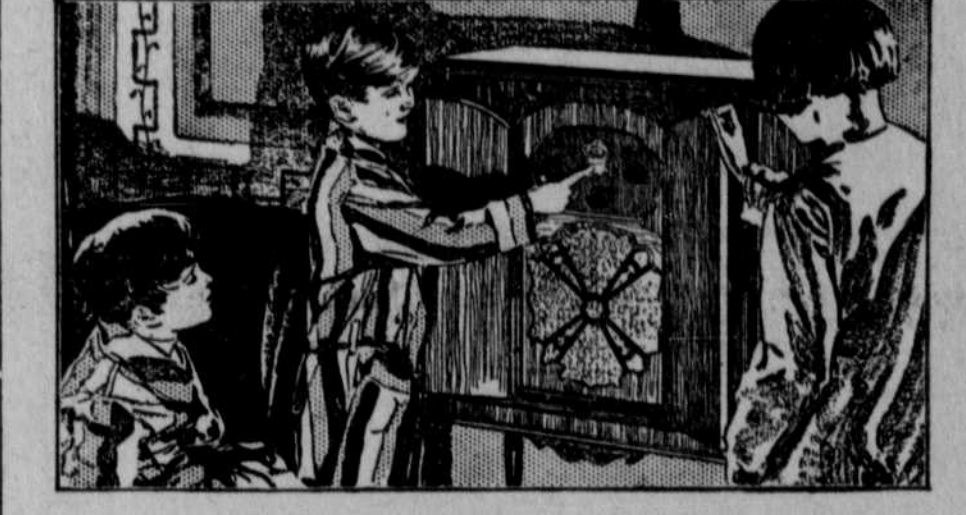
Washington—The historical error, repeatedly repeated, that Francis Scott Key wrote the national anthem on board a British man-of-war in Baltimore harbor in the War of 1812, has been denied by Francis Key-Smith, great-grandson of the composer, a resident of Washington.

In a speech at Baltimore, Mr. Key-Smith produced documentary evidence to prove the "Star Spangled Banner" was written on board an American ship. He had letters of his great-grandfather and documents from the state department to prove his contention.

The great-grandson related how Key several hours on the morning of September 14, stood at the rail of the American sloop in the harbor and watched the American shore. The British fire had ceased. On the back of an envelope, Key made the first draft of the inspiring lines to the national anthem. The words subsequently were revised and given to the public. Mr. Key-Smith said the name of the
