JASPER H. RITTS

Jasper H. Ritts was born May 29, 1870, in Chicasaw county, Iowa. He was fifty-nine years, seven months and twenty-one days old at the time of his death. At the age of ten years he moved with his parents to Washta, Iowa, where he lived until he reached the age of eighteen years, when he went to work for himself. At the age of twenty-three years he was united in marriage to Lieu Ann Hammond, at Vermillion, South Dakota. He made his home at Hartington, Nebr., for two years before coming to O'Neill where he resided until November 24th last year, when he went to Eugene, Oregon, with the view of making his home with his daughter, Mrs. O. F. Herring; he expressed himself as believing that the climate of that locality would be beneficial to

his health. He passed away at 6:45 o'clock Sunday afternoon, January 19th. He leaves to mourn his death, one daughter, Mrs. O. F. Herring, Eugene, Oregon, and three sons, Lloyd Ritts, Floyd Ritts and Lester Ritts, all of O'Neill. His wife passed away in 1910; also a son, Buhl Russell, in 1911; other relatives who will mourn his death are his mother, Mrs. Dan Ritts, Washta, Iowa; three sisters, Mrs. Rose Aten, Long Pine, Nebraska; Mrs. Lizzie Anderson and Mrs. Pearl Nelson, Marcus, Iowa; four brothers, Rob, Tim and Paul Ritts, Washta, Iowa, and Clifford Ritts, Fonda, Iowa; two grandchildren, Betty and Joe.

He has been in poor health for the past four years; he passed away peacefully.

"Jap" Ritts, as he was familiarly known, was a man who counted his friends by his acquaintances; he was a friend to everyone. He was a hard working man who took a great interest in his children who are exemplary men and women. Following the death of his wife he moved to O'Neill and purchased a home at the northwest corner of town where he farmed and raised stock until his health became impaired when he retired from actual management of the farm work.

The funeral services were held from the Methodist church Saturday afternoon at two o'clock, conducted by Rev. O. A. Fortune. Burial was in Prospect Hill cemetery.
