RESOLUTION
WHEREAS, the Supreme Court of the State of Nebraska in a recent decision has determined that banks accepting checks or drafts from County Treasurers are liable for the money if the check or draft turns out to be worthless or if the bank upon which the check or draft has been drawn should fail before the check or draft has been paid, and

WHEREAS, in view of that decision, Holt County Banks have refused to accept from the County Treasurer of Holt County for deposit checks or drafts of tax payers, banks or other persons, and

WHEREAS, it is impractical for the County Treasurer to obtain cash from all tax payers, and

WHEREAS, at the urgent request of this Board and the County Treasurer, the O'Neill banks have finally agreed to accept from the County Treasurer, such checks and drafts as the Treasurer may receive for taxes and,

WHEREAS, this will necessitate keeping a collection register and considerable extra work in connection therewith and,

WHEREAS, aid banks demand compensation for such additional work and for the additional expense incident to obtaining and keeping additional collection records and additional postage, and

WHEREAS, depository banks outside of O'Neill have been invited to handle an active checking account for the County Treasurer of Holt County and have refused to handle an active checking account and,

WHEREAS, said active checking account is handled by the O'Neill depository banks who pay an annual interest charge of two per cent on the average daily deposit to Holt County.

NOW, THEREFORE, I move you that we pay to the O'Neill depository banks from the general fund of Holt County a service charge of two per cent on the average daily deposit maintained in said banks by the County Treasurer of Holt County.

Clerk of the District Court: One deputy at a salary fixed by statute.

County Clerk: One deputy at a salary fixed by statute and other help when needed at a salary of \$90 per month.

County Attorney: One stenographer at a salary of \$90 per month.
County Judge: One clerk at a salary of \$90 per month.

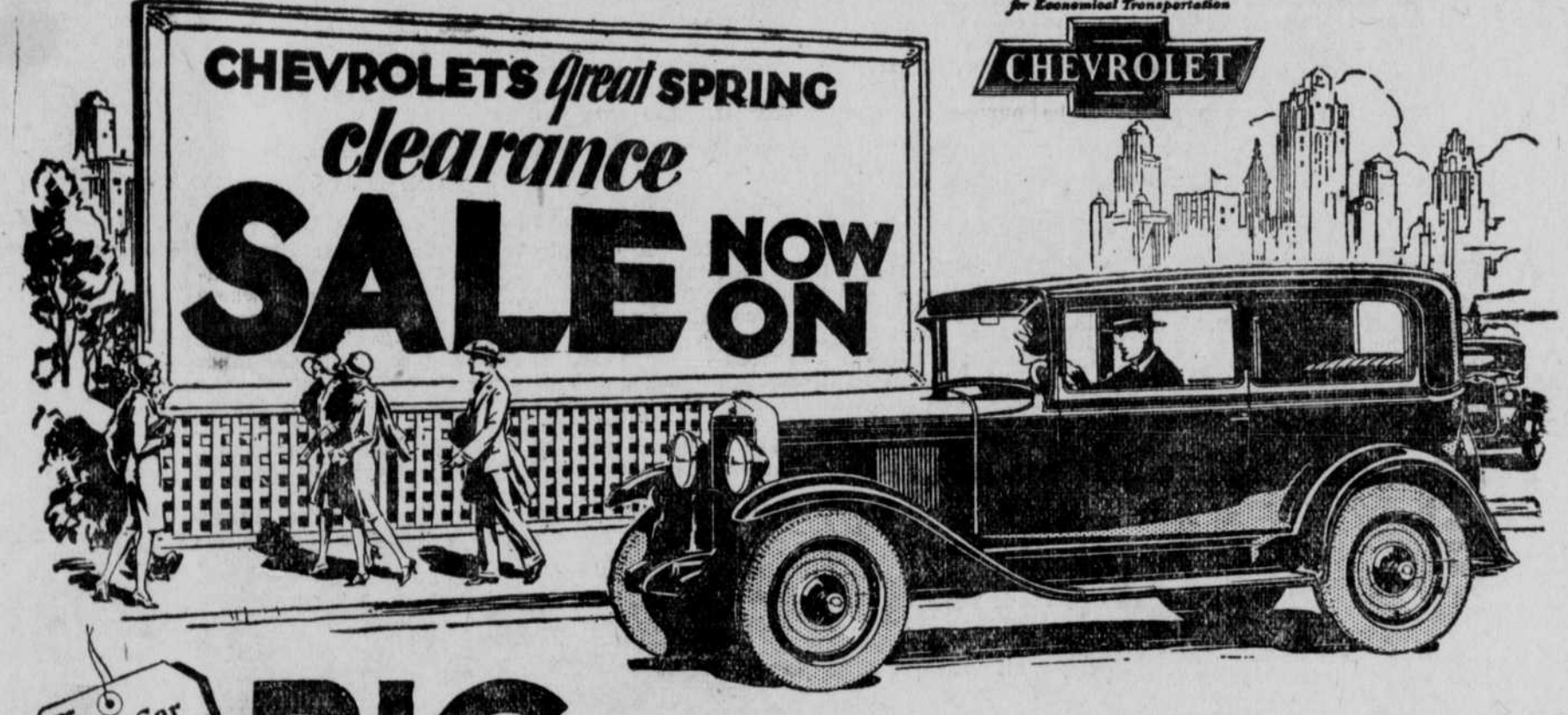
