New Telephones to Be Installed Soon

In order that the new common battery telephone equipment may be more quickly placed in service, the magneto telephones now in place are equipped so they may be used temporarily with the new equip-

These magneto telephones soon will be replaced with new common battery type equipment. About 400 telephones will be affected as all town subscribers in O'Neill will be supplied with the new type of equipment.

After common battery service is established, town subscribers will be able to signal the operator merely by lifting the receiver from the hook. Placing the receiver back on the hook will signal her that you are through talking.

The work of rebuilding O'Neill's telephone system is nearing completion and this city soon will have one of the finest telephone plants for a city of this size in the state.
