Holt County Board met pursuant to adjournment; all members present. Board called to order by the chairman.  
Minutes for Jan. 23, 1930 read and approved.

Board then went into committee of the whole and continued checking county officers.  
3 o'clock p. m.; committee arose and the following resolution was read:

**RESOLUTION**

Whereas, on January 22nd, 1906, the County Board of Holt County, by resolution recorded in Record G at page 251, for the purpose of making Highway 121 more passable, laid out three detours on said Highway numbered 148 and described particularly as:

Commencing at a point on Range line between Sections 6 and 18 of Township 26, said point being (2.00) two chains south of the NW 1/4 corner of Section 6, Twp. 26, N of Range 11, running thence N 32 degrees, 30 minutes E. 7.70 chains, thence N 2.00 chains, thence N 26 degrees 20 minutes West 9.46 chains to road No. 121 on above mentioned Range line.

Also commencing at the 1/4 Section corner on the east side of Section 24, Twp. 27 N of Range 12 on same Range line, thence N 12 degrees 20 minutes, W 14.08 chains, thence N 1 degree 30 minutes, E. 30.44 chains, thence N. 30 degrees 50 minutes, E. 7.46 chains to Range line at a point 10.40 chains N. E. corner of Sec. 24, 27-12.

Also commencing at 1/4 corner on East side of Sec. 13-27-12 and running thence north 17 degrees, West 7.00 chains, thence N. 30.99 chains, thence N 29 degrees 40 minutes East 4.33 chains to a point on Range line 1.23 chains North of the N. E. corner of Sec. 13-27-12 and connecting with road No. 121 at this point and

Whereas said detours are not now being used and have not been used for a number of years and,  
Whereas, Highway 121 as originally laid out on a straight line now is, and for years have been traveled as originally laid out, and,  
Whereas, said detours are now of no use to Holt County, or said road work or the traveling public,

Now, therefore, be it resolved that said detours numbered 148 as above described be, and the same hereby re-vacated and that the engineer be instructed to strike said detours from the road record of Holt County.

**Magneto Telephones Being Equipped  
Temporarily to Provide  
Common Battery Service**

New Telephones to Be Installed Soon

In order that the new common battery telephone equipment may be more quickly placed in service, the magneto telephones now in place are equipped so they may be used temporarily with the new equipment.

These magneto telephones soon will be replaced with new common battery type equipment. About 400 telephones will be affected as all town subscribers in O'Neill will be supplied with the new type of equipment.

After common battery service is established, town subscribers will be able to signal the operator merely by lifting the receiver from the hook. Placing the receiver back on the hook will signal her that you are through talking.

The work of rebuilding O'Neill's telephone system is nearing completion and this city soon will have one of the finest telephone plants for a city of this size in the state.
