

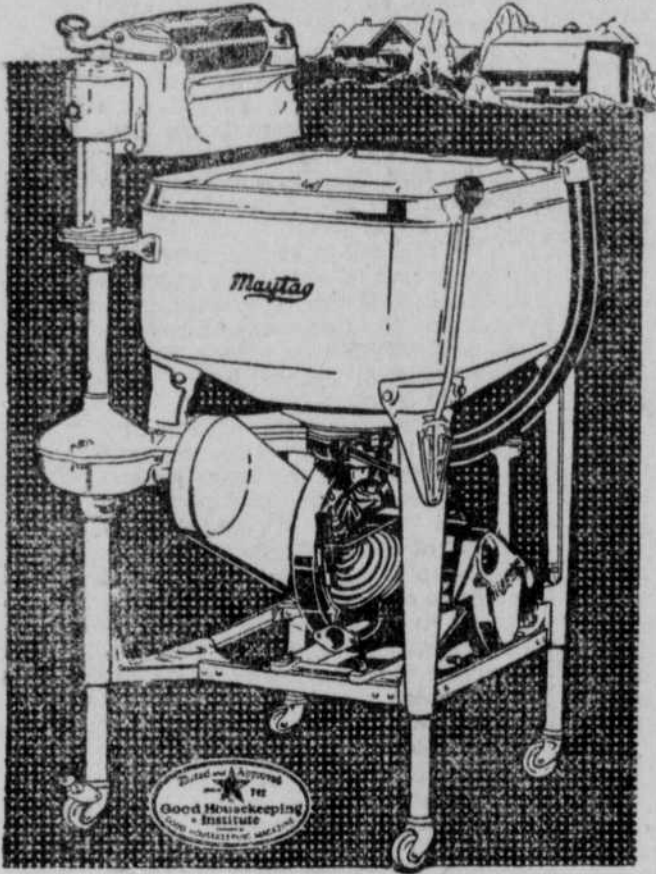

More than 3,500 gallons of alleged liquor and equipment valued at over one hundred thousand dollars was secured. About thirty federal officers took part in the raid; they were from Oklahoma, Kansas and Nebraska.

When the road is completed to Bartlett the route will be in fairly good condition the entire distance. A considerable portion of the distance is hard surfaced at this time.

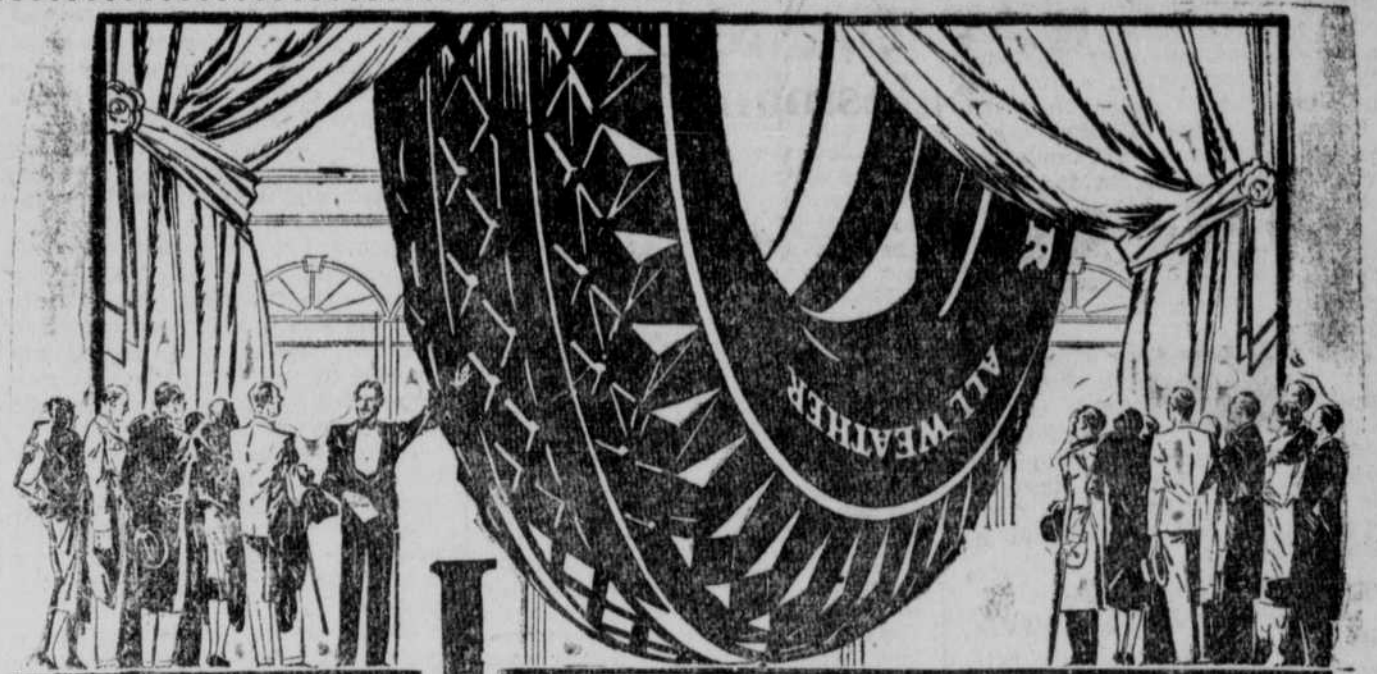
The O'Neill people should lend every aid possible to see that the road is marked through this part of the state as it will bring considerable new traffic this way that is now going elsewhere.

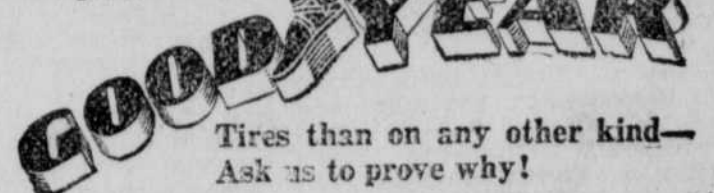
