### NEW MISSOURI RIVER BRIDGE TO OPEN TO TRAFFIC

Nebraska City, Neb.—(UP)—The new Waubonsie highway bridge, spanning the Missouri river here will be opened to traffic Sunday morning, five days before the date set for the official dedication, it was announced by George D. Dobson, chief engineer for the Waubonsie Bridge company.

The bridge was ready for traffic late in September, Dobson said, and could have been opened then if paving leading up to the approach on the Iowa side of the bridge had been completed.

The new paving on Iowa primary No. 3 will be opened to the public Sunday and will make the Waubonsie bridge a connecting link of the hard surfaced road systems of southern Iowa and Nebraska and a link in the all-weather highway systems reaching from Canada to the Gulf of Mexico and from east to west coast via Denver and Chicago.

### NEBRASKA MAN CLIMBS HIGHER

#### Becomes Superintendent of Minneapolis General Hospital

Ainsworth, Neb.—(Special)—Dr. Charles E. Remy who has just been named superintendent of the Minneapolis General hospital, was reared here and later practiced medicine here. He has been superintendent of the Montefiore hospital at Pittsburg, Pa.

Dr. Remy took up his duties October 1, moving to Minneapolis with his wife and daughter. He was graduated from the University of Nebraska medical college in 1910 and practiced medicine at Omaha until 1913. Then he came to Ainsworth and practiced for four years with his father.

He entered the medical corps of the army during the war and rose to the rank of lieutenant colonel and was in charge of a 5,000-bed convalescent unit at Beau desert hospital center near Bordeaux, France, when the war ended.

After the war he served as clinical director at the Norfolk, Neb., state hospital and at the South Dakota state hospital at Yankton. In 1925 he was appointed assistant superintendent of the Michael Reese hospital of Chicago.

### WIDELY KNOWN NEBRASKA MAN HAS SUDDEN DEATH

Lincoln, Neb.—(Special)—William H. Kelknap, former resident of northeastern Nebraska, died here Friday following a heart attack. He was one of the oldest Masons in the state and was prominent in G. A. R. circles. He was born in Yonkers, N. Y., July 30, 1845. He settled on a homestead in Nebraska in 1867, but later returned to New York and was president of the Yonkers Hat Manufacturing company for 10 years and treasurer of the Peekskill Hat Manufacturing company for two years. He again came to Nebraska and located near Blair where he was secretary-treasurer of the Haller Proprietary company, which post he held until his removal to Lincoln, in 1920. He is survived by his wife, Marie F. Belknap; two sons, Stanley R. of Omaha and William H. of New York City; and one daughter, Mrs. Adeline P. Hauks, whose wedding he attended here on the day preceding his death.

### DENIES SHE IS TO BE SECRETARY OF LABOR

Grand Island, Neb.—(UP)—Miss Grace Abbott, director of the federal children's bureau in Washington, who is visiting relatives here, her former home, denies that she has been offered the position of secretary of labor in the Hoover cabinet. Miss Abbott said the understanding in Washington is that Secretary Davis will hold office until after election, resigning if he is successful in his campaign for election to the Senate from Pennsylvania. She was to have addressed the Nebraska Federation of Woman's Clubs at Alliance Thursday, but missed train connections at Omaha. She will return to Washington, Sunday night.

### WAYNE COUNTY COUPLE MARRIED HALF CENTURY

Sholes, Neb.—(Special)—Mr. and Mrs. I. O. Jones celebrated their fiftieth wedding anniversary Sunday, October 5. He was born in Wales March 1, 1837 and came to the United States as a boy. Mrs. Jones was born in Wales, July 1, 1858 and came to the United States in the fall of 1879. They were married in Missouri. They emigrated from Bragmor, Mo., to Valentine, in Cherry county, Neb., in 1881, then they came to Wayne county, settling on a farm near here. They lived on this farm until they moved to Carroll, their present home.

### CALL FIRE DEPARTMENT TO DRIVE BIRDS AWAY

Fremont, Neb.—(Special)—The fire department was called out last night in an effort to drive away a huge flock of birds that has been roosting each night in the big trees at Seventeenth and Broad streets, much to the annoyance of surrounding residents. But the water thrown at the birds served only to drive them from one tree to another.

### APPEALS FOR AID FOR SANTEE INDIANS

Norfolk, Neb.—(Special)—Congressman Edgar Howard has made an appeal for the Santee and Ponca Indians, who are located near Niobrara. These natives of America have suffered almost a complete crop failure and are destitute. At present no government funds are available for their help. The plea was addressed to the women in particular, asking that they send packages of discarded clothing as well as jellies or preserves to these people who are in real need of food and clothing.

### Night Air Mail Bags to Be Guarded From Fire

A fireproof mail bag, perfected after years of experiment, will soon be placed into use on the night air mail from New York to Chicago, according to an announcement of the Post Office department. It is believed the new pouch will eliminate any loss through fire of mail that is carried by the air route. The fireproof bag, which is 100 per cent asbestos throughout, will be slightly larger than the pouch now in use and will be equipped with a triple closing device which will prevent

flames penetrating the bag through its neck. Steel rivets will be a feature of the construction, and the bag will weigh about 15 pounds.

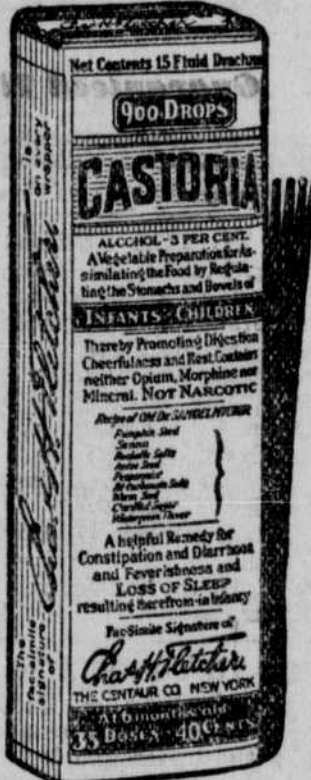
### Before Anesthetics
