EDUCATIONAL NOTES

Some complaint has come to this office that teachers are being bothered with book agents and salesmen. I would like to call your attention to Section 1, House Roll 392, Sections 1 and 2, making it unlawful for any agent, peddler, salesman or representative of any commercial enterprise to call upon a teacher between the hours of 8:30 and 5:30 p. m. on all days that the school in which he or she is teaching is in session. Any person who shall violate the purpose and intent of this law shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction be fined not to exceed \$100, or by imprisonment in the county jail not to exceed 90 days or both. There is no exception to this law. Any teacher troubled with agents of any kind should notify the sheriff. The County Superintendent has visited in the following schools during the past week: District 5, 69, 72, 152, 168, 174, 194, 207, 231 and 241.
