Marion Lee Foster, six months old, has been selected as America's champion farm baby in a contest sponsored by the American Farm Bureau Federation.

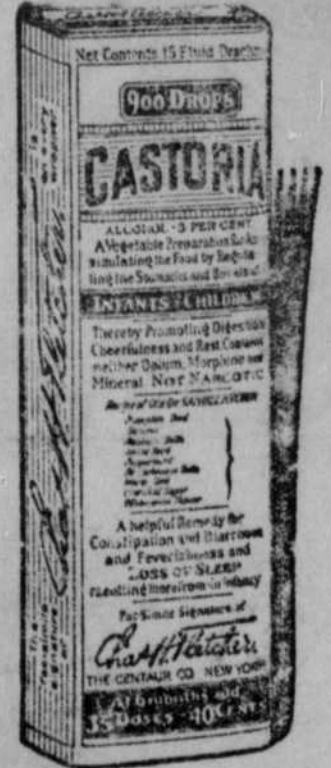
