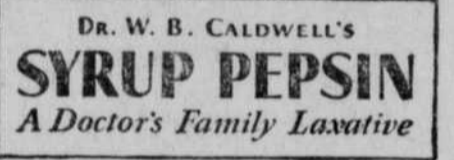


ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS

Q. How was Alaska flag selected? E. J. P. A. The contest was held by the American Legion, Department of Alaska, in the public, private, and native schools in the territory for the purpose of selecting an official flag for Alaska. A law passed by the legislature of the department of Alaska on May 2, 1927, provided that the design of the official flag (the winning design) is eight gold stars in a field of blue, so selected for its simplicity, its originality, and its symbolism. The blue, one of our national colors, typifies the evening sky, the blue of the sea and of mountain lakes and of wild flowers that grow in Alaskan soil, the gold being significant of the wealth the lies hidden in Alaska's hills and streams; and the law also provides that the governor shall cause the original design to be encased properly and placed in the Alaska Historical museum and that due credit be given to Benny Benson, age 13 years, a student in the seventh grade of the Mission Territorial school, near Steward, Alaska, the designer of the flag, herein described and adopted, as the official flag of Alaska.

Q. Why has America its present system of weights and measures? H. H. A. In the early colonial days of America, the weights and measures used by the colonists were naturally those of the mother country, and in most cases copies of the home standards were brought over and entrusted to the care of special officers of the Commonwealth. In the English colonies it was usually the yard of 1583 that was employed. At the time of the Revolution, the new country naturally continued with its existing British standards, and although the constitution gave Congress the power to fix the standard of weights and measures, nothing was immediately done. Thomas Jefferson in 1790 suggested in Congress the establishment of a decimal system. The question was again taken up in Congress in 1817 and 1830. On July 28, 1866, the metric system of weights and measures was legalized by act of Congress. In 1875 the United States joined with a number of others in the establishment of the International Bureau of Weights and Measures in Paris.

Q. Does the Salvation Army in this country contribute to the Salvation Army in Great Britain? E. P. A. The Salvation Army says that it does not. Some misapprehension has arisen because of the fact that the international headquarters of the Salvation Army is located in London, England, but no foreign country contributes to its support. The missionary enterprises, however, are directed from the international headquarters and every country makes contributions to the missionary field in the same manner as each church makes contributions through some central source. The Salvation Army missionary operations are supported through what is known as a Self Denial fund. This is brought to the attention of Salvation Army members, adherents, and friends every year. The proceeds of this fund are divided equally between home and foreign missions.

Q. Please give a short sketch about fans. F. E. A. "Customs of Mankind" says that "Fans have an interesting history. The first fan was probably a palm leaf or some other natural device appropriated by man to keep away flies or gnats, perhaps even to cool the fevered brow in tropical climates. We know that in Egypt, 2,000 years ago, fashionable hosts had special servants to stand behind dinner guests and fan them with huge papyrus fans. In France the fan reached the height of its development under Louis XIV. We read that 'Fans are invariably accompanied by feminine costume and that they are of rare beauty, exquisitely painted and mounted on sticks of carved or painted wood, mother-of-pearl, carved ivory, or gold. There are over 500 makers of fans in Paris and they enjoy special privileges accorded to them by the King.'

Q. Why is it considered bad luck for a woman to enter a coal mine? D. E. M. A. The origin of the superstition regarding a woman's entering a coal mine is obscure. It has existed in England, Scotland and Wales from very early times. In many parts of England it is customary for the men to enter and leave the pits during the night and it is regarded as an omen of bad luck if they meet a woman when they first leave the pits or leave their homes before entering them. A similar superstition exists among the fishermen of Yorkshire. If they meet a woman when leaving home they immediately return home.

Q. Please describe Italy's flag. G. A. A. The royal standard of Italy consists of a square blue field on which is centered the national coat-of-arms. When Napoleon made the northern provinces of Italy into a kingdom in 1805, he gave it a flag of three colors—green next to the flagstaff, white in the middle and red at the fly end. This flag disappeared when Napoleon was overthrown but was revived when Victor Emmanuel, king of Sardinia, and a member of the House of Savoy, became king. At the present day Italy's flag consists of a crown, the central white vertical stripe of Napoleon's green, white and red.

Q. Where is the Pohick Church? W. W. A. Pohick Church, parish church of Mount Vernon, is six miles from the Mansion, on the highway between Washington and Richmond. It was built from plans drawn by George Washington (1768-70), a vestryman there for 20 years. Among the rectors of the church was 'Parson' Westons, who recorded stories of Washington's boyhood, such as that of the cherry tree. The church was used as a stable during the Civil war but now is well restored. It contains the original baptismal font which was lost for many years but finally reclaimed from a farmyard. The pew of Washington is reserved.

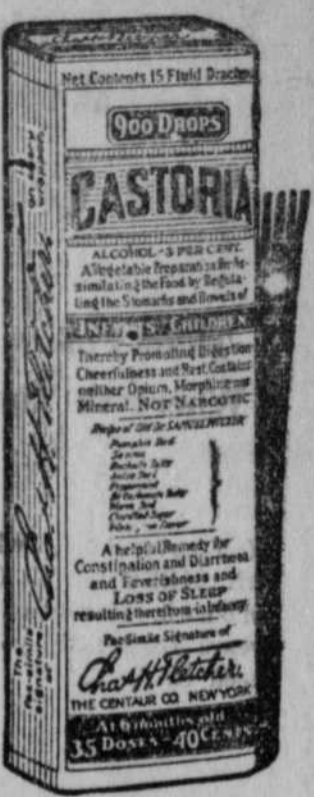

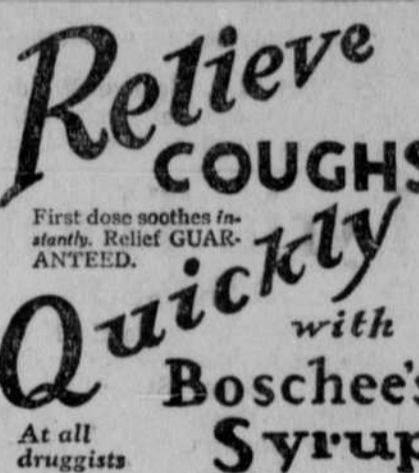
