BENJAMIN FRANKLIN

The following essay on Benjamin Franklin was written by John Soukup, son of Mr. and Mrs. Leonard Soukup, formerly of O'Neill but who now reside at Fort Lauderdale, Florida. The story is clipped from the Fort Lauderdale Daily News of January 19, 1931:

"What I like about Franklin is that without money or friends he made the long climb from poverty to fame. His beginnings were very hard. Benjamin's brother owned a printing shop, and he worked as an apprentice. He used to write little stories on the sly and send them to his brother to be printed in the paper. He listened with delight to what his brother said, and his brother's friends, in praise of their unknown contributor; but when the secret came out the brother was jealous and treated the boy so cruelly that he ran away to Philadelphia.

Benjamin found a place with a printer and went to London to get more experience. He later published a newspaper and attracted attention throughout the colonies. He founded a debating society, a public library, the first American magazine, the University of Pennsylvania, and he invented some other things.

Franklin was one of the signers of the Declaration of Independence. He went to France and his fame as a scientist, and reputation as the author of Poor Richard's Almanac, and his wit, made him one of the most popular men at the French court. He had a large part in the framing of the Constitution under which we live."
