
HOW THREAD PREVENTS LIFTING UP AN UMBRELLA



Prepare for this trick by drawing a black thread through your sleeve, fastening one end to a button of your vest, and making a loop in the other and placing it between two of your fingers. Let the loop extend about one-half inch above the fingers and you are ready for the trick. Ask some one to hold an umbrella extended, grasping it in the center of the handle. Extend your hand, back upward, place the tip of the umbrella upon the hand, and while doing so slip the loop of the thread over the umbrella tip. Then ask the person to try and raise the umbrella from your hand. Although it is held by only a thin thread, it will be found practically impossible to budge it. Ask the person to try using both hands, and unless he has unusual strength in his arms, it will be found equally difficult to raise the umbrella.
