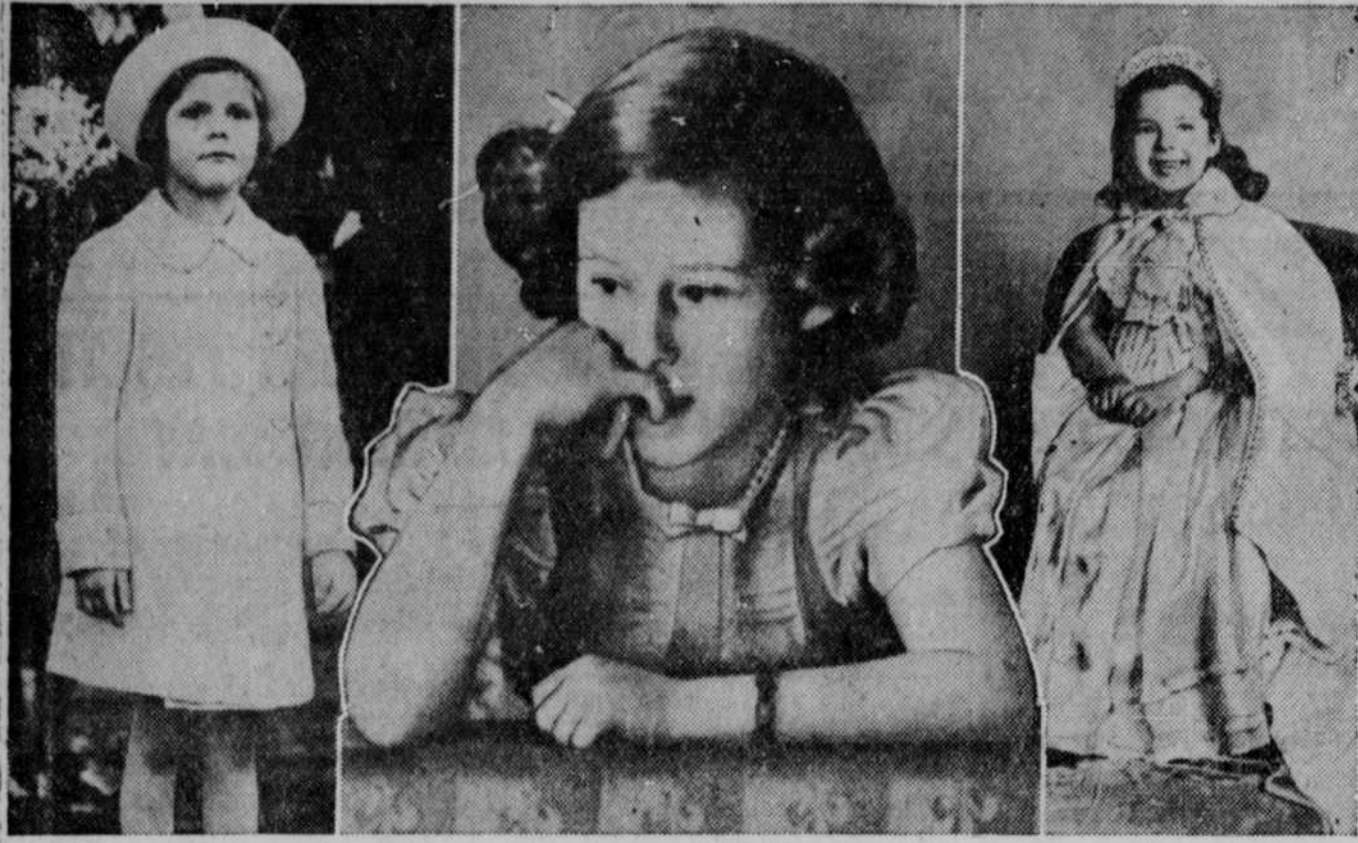
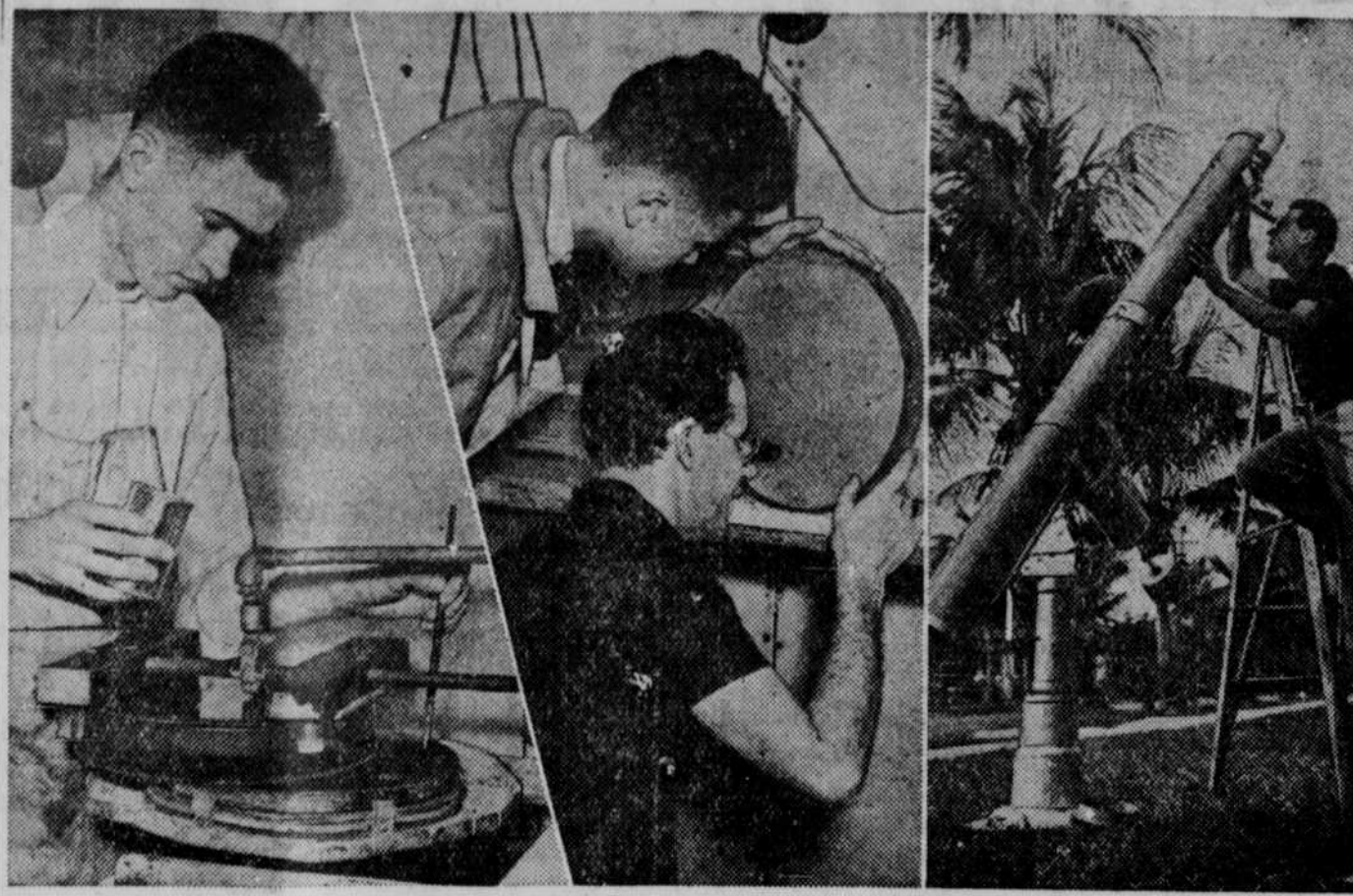


Royal Princesses Busy With Affairs of State

Powerful Telescopes Manufactured in \$20 Plant



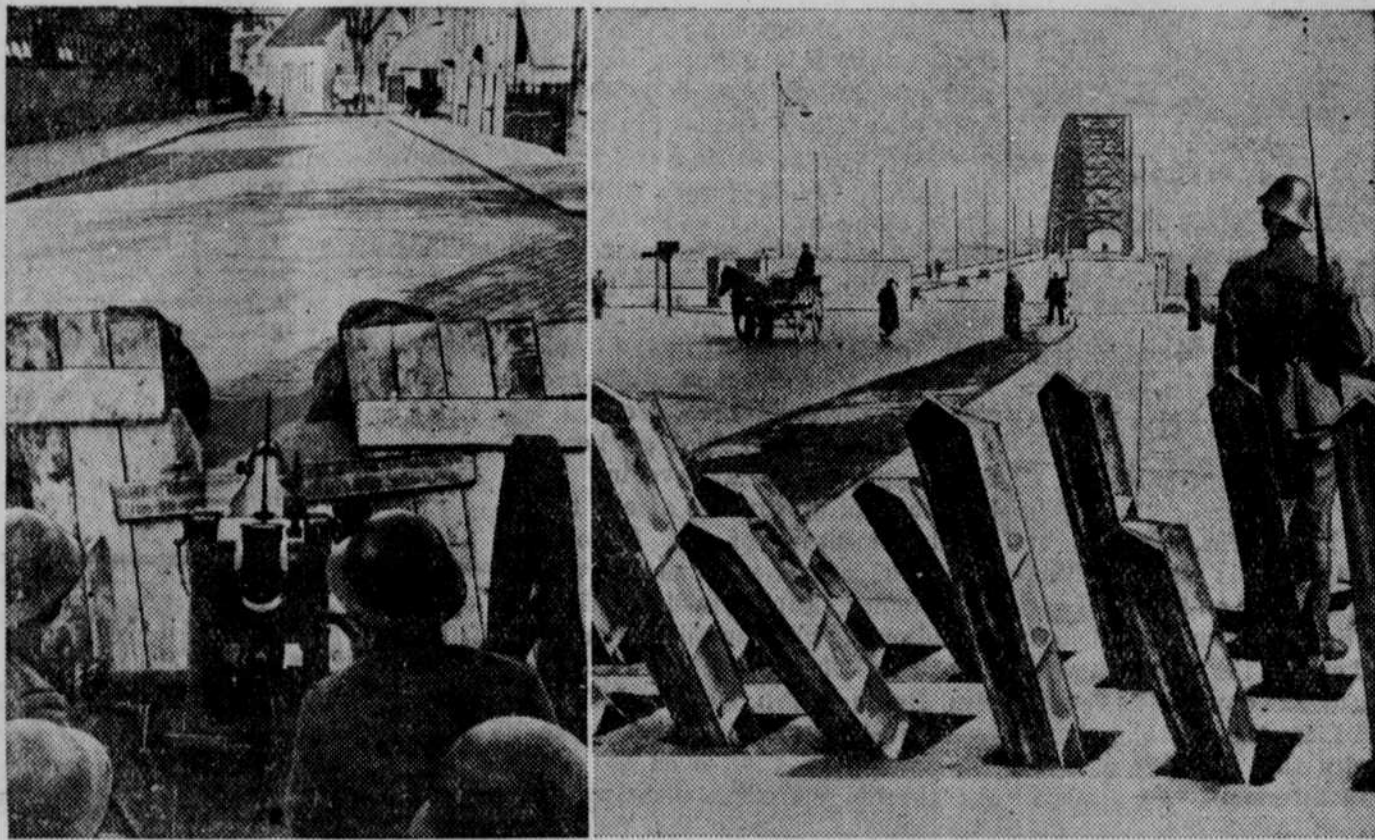

Smith Jr., are operating a "factory" they built and equipped at a total cost of \$20, and are turning out telescopes that have attracted the praise of Dr. G. H. Lutz, America's foremost telescopic engineer. Left: Smith applies carborundum to the grinding glass as the mirror rotates back and forth. Twelve inches in diameter, this mirror is very large for any but a professional attempt. Center: The mirror is studied for possible defects. It takes approximately eight months to grind the mirror. Ancient Caves May Serve as Air Raid Shelters

As Holland Prepares to Guard Her Frontiers



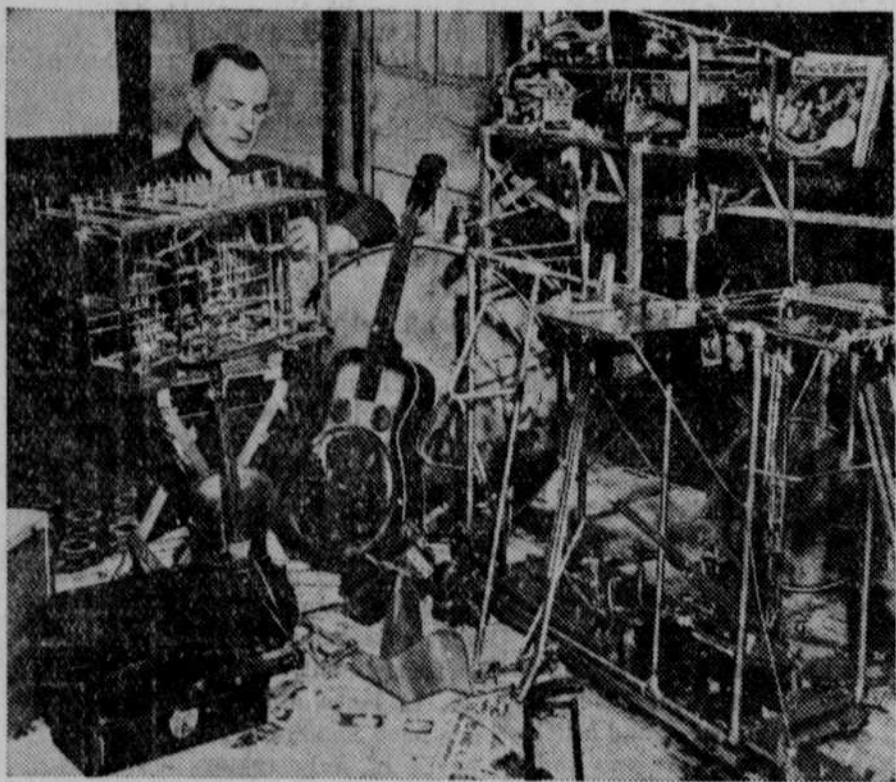

Deer Hunters Discover Huge Meteorite



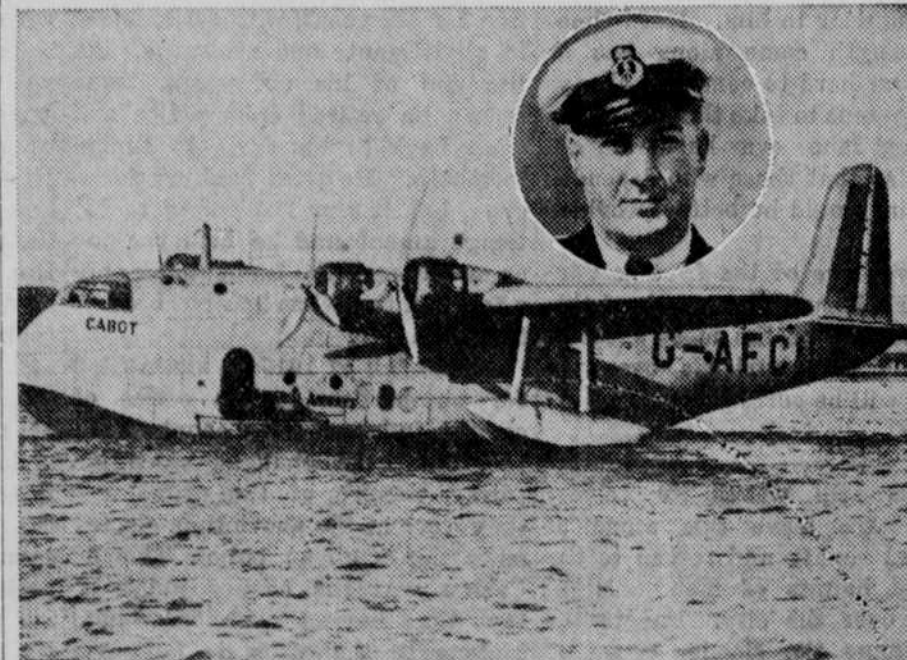

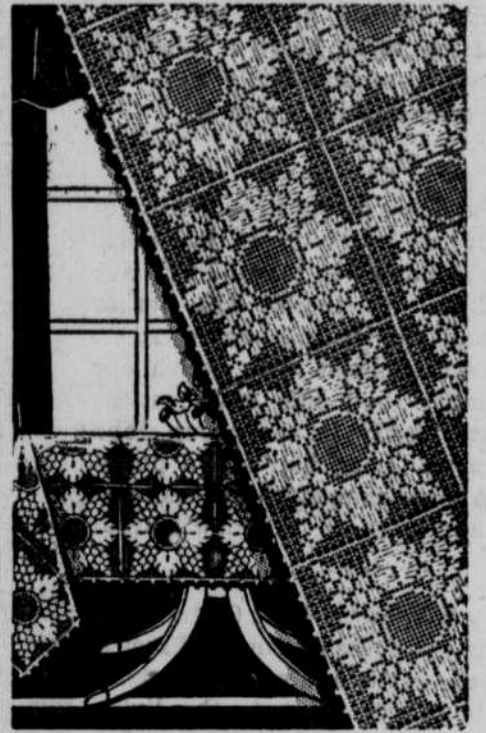
