In addition to a discussion of suggestions on how to improve the appearance of homes in this county a film strip showing how other people have used practical means of making their homes more attractive will be run. Although this is a project club lesson, the public is invited because it is a subject in which the whole community is interested.

State Highway Patrolmen Are Still Very Active

On a complaint signed by Patrolman Lawrence Russell, Dean Fink, of Gregory, South Dakota, was arrested on January 27th and brought before County Judge Louis Reimer, on a charge of driving and operating a truck, in Nebraska, without first having complied with the requirements of the law in the State of Nebraska, set out in Section 60-302, of the 1939 supplement to the compiled statutes of Nebraska for 1929, and other sections relating to the payment of license fees, permit fees and fees of whatever character owners of trucks are required to pay in the State of Nebraska, and without having said truck licensed pursuant to the laws of the State of Nebraska. Mr. Fink pled guilty to the charge, and was fined \$100.00 and costs, amounting to \$3.10. The fine imposed by Judge Reimer was the minimum fine, as stated by the law for a case of this kind.
