ORDINANCE NO. 194-A

(First Publication Feb. 15, 1940.)  
An ordinance vacating a certain alley in the City of O'Neill, Nebraska; providing for making a record for such vacation in the office of the City Clerk of O'Neill, Nebraska; providing for a record of such vacation in the office of the Register of Deeds of the County of Holt and State of Nebraska.
