The federation exists only thru the support of individual sportsmen through their purchase of wildlife stamps. There are no paid officers in Nebraska. There are only two in the national headquarters in Washington, D. C.

Receipts from the stamp sales are divided on a 50-50 basis-half to the national office; half to the state organization.

These funds make it possible to campaign for favorable legislation, legislation that will have farreaching effects on the nation's and the state's wildlife resources.

The federation builds for tomorrow and in the short time it has been operative, has worked successfully for the passage of such beneficial bills as the Pittman-Robertson act which gave to Nebraska \$30,000 in 1939 for conservation projects. There will be approximately \$50,000 available to Nebraska in 1940 from this federal aid

Here in Nebraska the Federation was instrumental in obtaining the two state game farms, worked for the passage of the increased game permit bill which enabled Nebraska
