Sealed bids will be received at the office of the Department of Roads and Irrigation in the State House at Lincoln, Nebraska, on July 25, 1940, until 10:00 o'clock A. M., and at that time publicly opened and read for Grading, Culverts, One Bridge and incidental work on the O'Neill-Spencer Federal Aid Projects Nos. 14-A(2) and 14-D(2) Federal Aid Road.

The proposed work consists of constructing 8.6 miles of Graded Earth Road.
