Anna T. Clark was born September 3, 1902, in Brooklyn, New York, and died at her home at Inman, Nebraska, September 10, 1940.

She grew to womanhood in New York, and on June 30, 1920 she was united in marriage to Arthur G. Clark, at Brooklyn. In July of the same year she came with her husband to Inman, Nebraska, and since then had lived in the Inman community.

Three children were born of this union, a son and two daughters, all of whom are at the home near Inman. Mrs. Clark was happily converted and on May 6, 1923, she was baptized and became an active member of the Methodist Church of Inman, and has since been interested in the church and Sunday School, and used her influence for the building of the kingdom.

From her early girlhood she was troubled with a heart ailment which kept her from strenuous exercise in play or labor, but she loved her home and did her best to make it a place where love and happiness abounded. For the past three years she often suffered much with this affliction, and during the past few weeks it was known that she could not long survive the pain of her serious affliction. She quietly went from us on Tuesday afternoon, in the midst of a busy life of 38 years, and seven days.

She leaves behind besides the husband, Arthur G. Clark, a son, Norbert, two daughters, Mrs. Deloris Stevens and Wilda Clark, son-in-law, Robert Stevens, and a granddaughter, Dolores Lynette Stevens; and her only living sister, Miss Jennie Costello, of Brooklyn, N. Y., who came by plane to Omaha to be at the services.
