## 1,500 Poppies on Order by Auxiliary

Employment for thousands of disabled war veterans during the coming Winter and Springs months will be provided by the American Legion auxiliary through its annual memorial poppy program, Mrs. D e a n Streeter, poppy chairman of Simonson unit of the auxiliary, has announced here.

Veterans will make poppies in Veterans Administration hospitals in many parts of the country and in convalescent workrooms operated by the auxiliary. Besides proving gainful employment for veterans unable to do other work, making the poppies is considered highly beneficial as occupational therapy.

During the past year, 11,826 disabled veterans were given employment making the memorial poppies which the auxiliary distributed to be worn in honor of the war dead on poppy day last May. Their earnings totalled \$357,759.67. More than 27,000,000 poppies were made. The distribution was carried out by 133,000 volunteer workers from the auxiliary and cooperating organizations.

Simonson unit No. 93, of O'Neill, already has placed an order for 1,500 poppies for next year, according to Mrs. Streeter.
