Rainy Weather and Frost in Phoenix

PHOENIX, ARIZ., Jan. 13.—As this is written on the 13th day of January, 1949, the writer knows exactly what the people of O'Neill are doing. They are digging themselves out of one of the worst storms in the history of Nebraska. The last issue of The Frontier, which arrived day before yesterday, contained a long, detailed, graphic story about the blizzard which occurred there recently, which piled up such huge drifts and did such widespread damage.

This is, indeed, a record-breaking winter for blizzards and heavy falls of snow in Nebraska and the Midwest. The Frontier speaks of snow drifts 18 feet deep and its graphic story is accompanied by pictures showing a view of O'Neill taken from an airplane and also the unusual sight of two Burlington locomotives overturned in the snow. When a powerful locomotive is overturned in snow drifts, that is proof enough of the severity of the storm.

Well, we don't have any such sensational story to relate about the weather in this country, but it is unusual and remarkable for the climate, too.

In the northern part of the state, there has been a record-breaking snowstorm with unusual cold and, in Phoenix and vicinity, there has been one of the longest, coldest rainy spells in recent years. It started before New Years and has continued intermittently ever since.

New Years day was clear and sunny just in time for the annual Salad Bowl football game and the sun has tried to shine a few times since; but, as this is written, it is raining harder than ever.

Obviously, the rain is a great blessing for it has been very dry for a long time in this state; but the serious part of it is that it has been accomplished by destructive floods. Extensive damage has been done to the citrus crop in Arizona, as it has in California. (Next week: The U. S. Mailman.)

DIES ON EVE OF 92d BIRTHDAY

William F. Sparrow a Descendant of Famed Pilgrim Fathers

ROYAL—William F. Sparrow died at his home in Brunswick on Friday, January 7 on the eve of his 92d birthday anniversary. He was a lineal descendant of Miles Standish and John Alden of historical fame.

Born January 8, 1857 at New Bedford, Mass., his father was a captain of a whaling vessel.

Following his father's death, his mother moved her family to Indiana where Mr. Sparrow became acquainted with Eve Barneil, whom he married on August 29, 1883, at Tina, Mo.

Three children resulted from this marriage: William, of Kansas City, Mo.; Harry, of Page, and Mary Kerrick, of Bayard, Colo.

Mr. Sparrow was employed for 20 years in a power house at Lincoln and then moved to a farm North of Royal, near the former Hering mill. A few years ago he moved to Brunswick.

Survivors: Widow; two sons; one daughter; 13 grandchildren, 20 great-grandchildren, and six great-great-grandchildren. One of the granddaughters is Maxine Sparrow, telephone operator at Orchard. A great-great-grandson, James Wesley Johnson, was born recently in the O'Neill hospital.
