BURIAL AT PAGE FOR WAR FATALITY

Pvt. Sorenson's Remains Arrive Saturday for Final Burial

PAGE — Short funeral services were held at the John Sorenson home and at the Page cemetery Saturday afternoon for Pfc. Eldridge Virgil Sorenson whose remains recently were returned from overseas.

Rev. T. O. Brownfield had charge of the services. Pallbearers were members of the American Legion: Leonard Miller, Richard Asher, Donald Heiss, Lloyd Cork, Nevan Ickes, jr. and Bernard Cornock.

Harry Cullen assisted the escort sergeant, who accompanied the body, fold the flag that was presented to his parents.

Eldridge Virgil Sorenson, son of Mr. and Mrs. Chris Sorenson, was born March 13, 1920, at Page. He grew to manhood in this vicinity and was inducted into the Army October 6, 1941.

He received his first training at Camp Roberts, Calif., and then was sent to San Luis Obispo. He completed his instructions at Fort Ord.

He served in the Aleutians, leaving the States April 23, 1943. In September, 1943, he was transferred to the Hawaiian Islands and he participated in the invasion of the Marshall Islands. It was on Leyte Island that Private Sorenson was mortally wounded on October 29, 1944, and there he was buried with full military honors.

Survivors include: Parents — Mr. and Mrs. Chris Sorenson; widow — Mrs. Archie Cleveland; brothers — John and James Sorenson, both of Page.

Private Sorenson's widow is the former Oral Jackson. Since his death she has remarried and now resides at Orchard.
