DROWNING VICTIMS IN DOUBLE BURIAL

ATKINSON — Laid to rest Friday in graves side-by-side in Wood Lawn cemetery at Atkinson were the bodies of the two Atkinson high school sophomores, Marvin Farewell, 15, and Harold Klinger, jr., 14, who perished Tuesday, May 10, in an abandoned gravel pit near Atkinson.

The two boys were drown in water estimated to be from 10- to 14-feet deep.

Funeral rites were held in the Atkinson high school auditorium. More than 600 persons overflowed the auditorium while Rev. Orin Graff, of the Presbyterian church, delivered the funeral sermon.

Eight girls of the Atkinson high school sophomore class sang hymns, and 12 sophomore boys served as pallbearers.

There was no school in Atkinson Friday afternoon and most of the business firms were closed during the funeral. The Seger funeral home was in charge of the double burial rite.

Klinger's survivors are his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Harold Klinger, sr.; one brother, Richard, 11; three sisters, Jeanette, 9; Sandra, 4; Sharon, 3. Farewell's survivors include the parents, Mr. and Mrs. L. H. Farewell; sister, Judy, 2, and his maternal grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Ed Steskal.

Time Extension Granted on Small Grain Delivery

A resealing program has been announced on wheat, oats and barley by the Holt county AAA committee.

Farmers with grain sealed will be paid or storing it on their farms at the following rates: wheat, 10 1/2 cents; barley, 10 cents; oats, 8 cents. Storage payments will be made if grain is stored on farms until April 30, 1950.

A resealing program may be announced on corn in the near future, officials said. Closing date for obtaining loans and purchases agreements on corn is June 30, 1949. Application for loans should be in the Holt office about two weeks before closing dates as loans have to be completed by June 30.
