25 YEARS AGO

September 11, 1924

John Stauffer, of Orchard, father of John N. Mr. Stauffer was assisting his son in putting up the hay crop and had just started working in the morning when the team became frightened at a passing car and ran away. Mr. Stauffer realizing that he was going to be thrown from the machine, threw himself away from the sickle; the wheel passed over his body lengthwise. He was unconscious for about two hours. He has been taken to his home in Orchard.

The fire department was called to the Clarence Zimmerman home on East Douglas street last Tuesday evening where a small blaze was discovered on the Northwest corner of the roof. The fire is supposed to have originated on the outside from a spark from the chimney. The fire was extinguished with garden hose and the chemical engine. This is the second fire that Mr. Zimmerman has suffered in a little over one year. The department had considerable difficulty in locating the place of the fire and traveled over a considerable portion of the business part of town before they found the fire. In reporting a fire to central or to the light plant, the location of the fire should be given so hat the fire department can be instructed correctly.
