Meeting called to order by the Chairman.

1:30. This was the time set for the Hearing on the road petition of Melvin Rexin. Twenty-three persons appeared before the Board in regard to this petition and it was discussed at length.

Motion was made by Cronk, seconded by Hubbard that the following Resolution be adopted in regard to this Petition. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, there has been previously established and now exists a public road extending on the boundary line between Holt County and Wheeler County, commencing at the Northwest corner of Wheeler County and extending East to the Southeast corner of Holt County, which said road is already designated as a part of the County Road System of Wheeler County and

WHEREAS, it is deemed desirable that such portions of the road described lying within the boundaries of Holt County shall be designated and established as a part of the County Road System of Holt County and thereafter said road in its entirety shall be by the concurrent action of the County Boards of Holt and Wheeler Counties designated as a county road to be maintained at the joint expense of the respective Counties of Holt and Wheeler.

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it hereby resolved that the County Board of the County of Holt does hereby designate all of that portion of the graded road lying within Holt County on the Southern boundary of said Holt

County extending from the Northwest corner of Wheeler County and running due East to the Southeast corner of Holt County, as a part of the County Road System of Holt County, Nebraska.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT hereafter said road in its entirety shall be maintained jointly by the Counties of Holt and Wheeler at their joint expense and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all improvements to and maintenance of said road shall be done by the respective Boards of the Counties of Holt and Wheeler who shall also agree upon all items of expenditure thereon and the manner of division of the same between the respective counties.

Motion was made by Hubbard, seconded by Batenhorst that this license be renewed. Motion carried.
