

### State Rural Youth Leader Visits Clubs

Guy Davis, State Rural Youth leader, visited in the O'Neill area Monday and Tuesday to suggest methods in improving organization and coordination of club government.

Davis, on a tour of the state Rural Youth clubs, said the Holt county clubs were capable of functioning themselves. This, he said, can only be attained through effective guidance in setting by clubs.

Monday Holt County Agent A. Neil Dawes and Davis visited the South Holt Rural Youth club at Chambers.

Davis said the state is interested in setting up Rural Youth clubs as a means of self-governed social recreation. The age group for the Rural Youth is 18-30. In the past this age group has been neglected, and organized clubs provides an outlet for the needed recreation.

This age group is particularly in need of guidance in home planning and community recreation because many in this group are marrying and settling down, Davis concluded.

Rural Youth clubs work under the direction of the county agent who in turn works with state club leaders and national leaders.

About 65 counties in the state of Nebraska now have Rural Youth clubs. Holt has two.

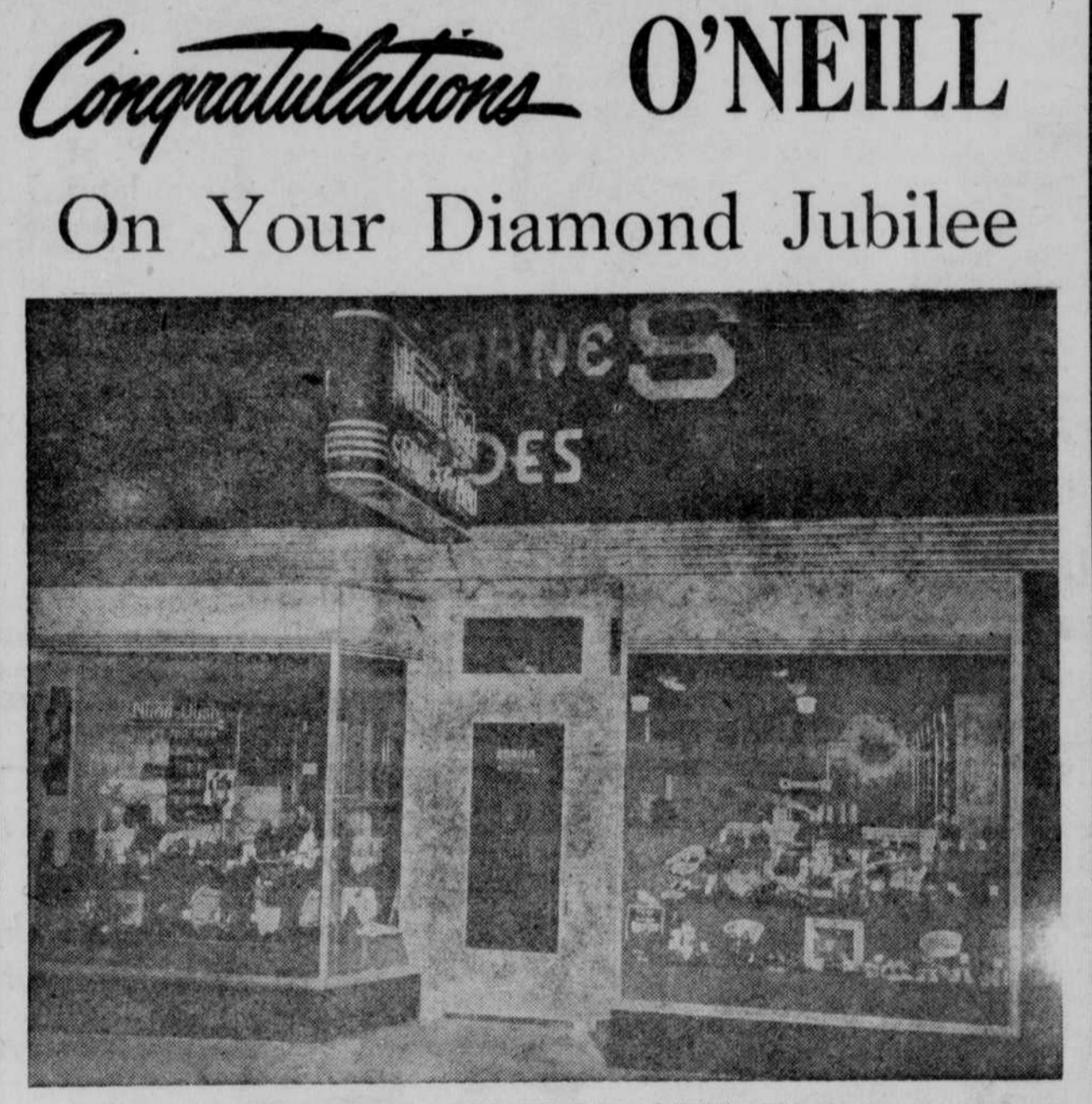
