County Agent A. Neil Dawes observed that the corn had withstood the high wind in "good shape."

Some late corn on the Wm. Grothe place, West of Emmet, was "severely" damaged.

In most places, however, mature corn suffered the worst damage, and sturdy immature corn stood up well.

Many newly-built haystacks were "opened up" and straw was strewn about the fields. Older, more settled stacks endured the gales.
