#### Senatorial Speculator

It looks as if Senator Thomas's speculating partner, Dyke Cullum, has diverse and widespread interest.

Last week it was revealed that Cullum, who frequently claims to represent Thomas, had bought 10 carloads of egg futures at the same time that the senator from Oklahoma had introduced legislation taking the support price off of eggs. Senator Thomas and Cullum have used a joint trading account on the commodity exchange in the past.

Now, in addition to eggs, it develops that Cullum has been pulling wires with the agriculture department regarding

Cullum's influence in agricultural matters results from the fact that Thomas, as chairman of the senate agriculture committee, can block or pass most farm legislation.

Therefore, when Cullum, who helps the senate write legislation, demands inside information from the agriculture department, agriculture officials can't tell whether they are giving it for legislative purposes or for speculative purposes. Naturally, inside knowledge of government purchases and price supports could be used to make big profits on the commodity market.
