When You and I Were Young —

Public School Pupils Go Populist in Straw Vote—'Not So Commendable'

50 Years Ago
November 9, 1899
The election in Nebraska last Tuesday was a surprise to all parties. Indications are that Holcomb carried the state by 15,000. In this congressional district the fight will be very close, but Neville is probably elected. Kinkaid carried every county in this judicial district as far as heard from, except Holt, and here he ran 300 ahead of his ticket. Westover and Harrington are elected judges with majorities of from 500 to 1,000. The Populists elected every county officer except clerk of the district court, which was won by John Skirving with a majority of 61. James Harnish would have been elected county superintendent had he made any effort, as Norval pulled through with a majority of only 46. The Republicans cast 1,013 votes for Reese this Fall as a Republican gain of 215. Holcomb got 1,497 votes as against 1,154 last Fall for Poynter, a Populist gain of 343.
On Tuesday, while the political pot was boiling the hardest downtown, the pupils at the public schools were given a chance to cast their ballots for the county candidates. Teaching the children how to vote is interesting to them and is a commendable practice. We understand the schools went Populist, which was not so commendable.

25 Years Ago
November 13, 1924
The fire department was called Sunday evening about 5:30 to extinguish a small blaze in the rooms occupied by John Miskimins, over the Nebraska State bank. John says that he accidentally started the fire in his bed about noon while lying upon the bed smoking. 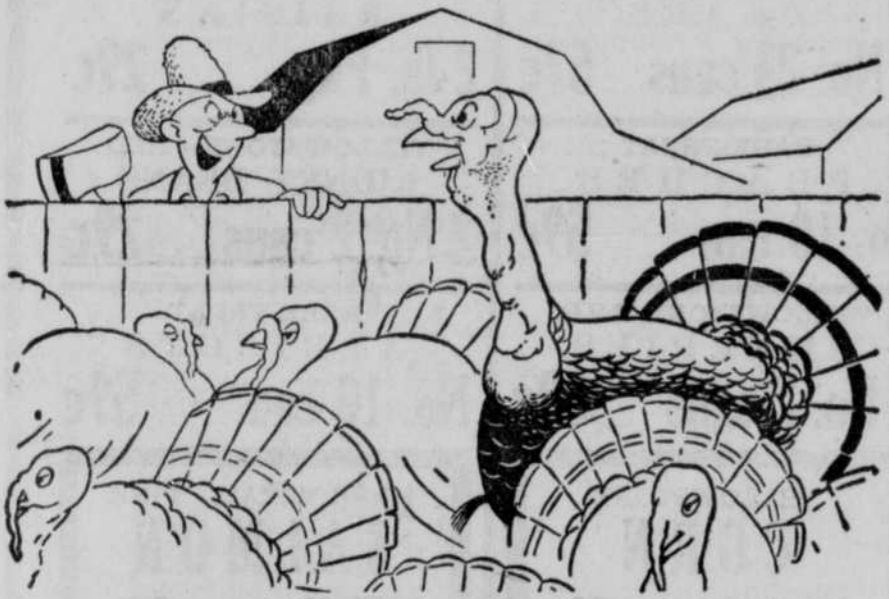
