Holt County Board of Supervisors met as per adjournment. All members present.
 Meeting called to order by the Chairman.
 Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved as read.

The Finance Committee reported that all the fees from the various offices have been remitted to the County Treasurer as required by law.

This was the time set for the Hearing on Fred Boettcher's road petition. Several men appeared in regard to it. No objections were made to this petition so motion was made by Batenhorst, seconded by Frickel that the following Resolution be adopted:

RESOLUTION
 WHEREAS, a petition containing signatures has been filed with the requisite number of the County of Holt for the abandonment of County Road No. 334 and the relocation of the same, Notice of Hearing has been published and the Hearing held.

NOW THEREFORE, I move you that County Road No. 334 and that portion thereof commencing at the Northwest corner of Section 18 in Township 27 North, Range 15, running South 3/4 miles through Sections 17, 20, 29 and 32, thence 1/4 miles East, thence running 1/4 mile East, thence South through Section 32 to the South quarter corner of Section 32, in Township 27, Range 15, thence from the North quarter corner of Section 5, Township 26, North, Range 15, South and Southeasterly through Sections 5, 8, 17, 20 and 29 to the Northwest corner of Section 33, thence Southeasterly through Section 33 to the quarter corner on the South side of Section 33 in Township 25 North, Range 15, thence from the quarter corner on the north side of Section 4 to center of Section 4, Township 25 North, Range 15, be abandoned and hereby is abandoned as a part of the County Road System.

County Road No. 334 be relocated as follows and that the following road be designated as County Road No. 334 and made a part of the County Road System of Holt County, Nebraska, as follows: Commencing at the Northeast corner of Section 13 in Township 27 North, Range 16, running thence South 1 1/2 miles to the East quarter corner of Section 24 in Township 27 North, Range 16, thence West through Sections 24 and 23 to the West quarter corner of Section 23 in Township 27 North, Range 16, thence 1 mile South to the East quarter corner of Section 27, Township 27 North, Range 16, thence West 1 1/4 miles through Section 27 to the Northwest corner of the East half of the Southwest quarter of Section 28 in Township 27 North, Range 16, West of the 6th P.M. in Holt County, Nebraska.

Motion was made by Borg, seconded by Hubbard that the following Resolution be adopted.

RESOLUTION
 BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Holt, State of Nebraska, that the State Engineer of the State of Nebraska, be, and he hereby is requested to procure the designation as a part of the Federal Secondary Road System of the following described road in Holt County, Nebraska, viz:

Commencing on the Southwest corner of Section 36, in Township 31, North, Range 10, West 6th P.M., running thence East on the section line one mile, running thence South on the section line a distance of ten miles to intersect with State Highway No. 108;

That the State Engineer take whatever steps may be necessary to secure the designation of the above described road as a part of the Federal Secondary Road System and to make the same eligible for the expenditure of State and Federal funds for the improvement thereof.

The motion on the above resolution being put to a vote resulted as follows: Aye: Clark, Cronk, Sterns, Batenhorst, Hubbard, Borg and Frickel. Nay: None. Whereupon the Chairman of the Board declared such Resolution duly passed and adopted.
