MRS. F. C. DAVIS, ATKINSON, DIES

WW I Gold Star Mother; Legion Post Named In Honor of Son

ATKINSON — Funeral services were held here for a World War I gold star mother Sunday at the Methodist church. She was Mrs. Mary Elizabeth Farley Davis, 79, Rev. W. C. Birmingham officiated and burial was in Woodlawn cemetery.

Mrs. Davis, 79, died Friday at her home here.

A gold star mother of WW I, the American Legion post 86 was named in honor of her only son, killed in action at sea. It remained the Farley post until shortly after the late war when it was renamed the Farley-Tushla post in honor of a World War II service man killed in action.

Mrs. Davis was a member of the American Legion auxiliary and the Women's Relief Corps. Members of the Legion post and auxiliary and the WRC attended the funeral in a body.

Pallbearers were: Willard Linville, J. J. Carroll, Mildard Allenwood, Mick McKay, Claude Humphreys and Neal McKee.

Born March 23, 1870, at Pennington Point, Ill., a daughter of Joel and Ellen Boyd Moore, Mrs. Davis came to Nebraska in 1885 and to Holt county during 1906.

Prior to the turn of the century, she married Mr. Farley and to them six daughters and a son were born. Mr. Farley died at the age of 42.

In 1936 Mrs. Farley married Charles Davis. Mr. Davis died in 1947.

Survivors include: daughters—Mrs. A. G. (Velma) Miller, of Atkinson; Ellen, of Atkinson, and Mrs. Harley (Effie) Chaney, of Cody, Wyo.; and four brothers.
