RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, due to the fact that the State Institutions are unable to receive the unusual number of insane patients committed from the County of Holt within the past year, it has been necessary that the Sheriff of Holt County keep a number of such patients in the County jail, which situation was unanticipated and has resulted in a depletion of the budget appropriated for operation of the Sheriff's office and jail, and

WHEREAS, the budget for the operation of the jail of this County has been depleted, and it being the opinion of this Board essential to the preservation and maintenance within the County of the administration of Justice, the Public Safety, the Public Welfare and the Public Health, that funds be provided in said budget for the operation and maintenance of such jail, and that an emergency does exist;

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that there be and there is hereby appropriated to the jail fund of the Sheriff's budget in said County the sum of Two Thousand Dollars to be added to said budget for the balance of the present fiscal year, said funds to be transferred from the general fund of said County.

A road Petition signed by Mrs. Robert MacLachlan and others was read. They were petitioning to have a road opened 66 ft. wide commencing at the East end of the Section line between Sections 36, Twp. 31, Range 14 & Section 1, Twp. 30, R. 14, in Holt County, running thence West 1 mile between Sections 36 & 1.

Motion was made by Frickel, seconded by Batenhorst that the above road be declared an open road. Motion carried.

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the Resolution, passed by County Board of Supervisors on the 30th day of August, 1949, relating to the establishment of a public road on the section line running east and west between Sections 18 and 19 in Township 31 North, Range 11, West of the 6th P. M. in Holt County, Nebraska, be and the same hereby is amended to further read and specify that there shall be placed at the east and west terminus of such road between Sections 18 and 19, automobile gates which are to be furnished at the expense of the County of Holt, and that the owners of said Sections 18 and 19 be not required to fence off the right of way of said road.

Motion was made by Frickel, seconded by Borg that the following Resolution be adopted: Carried.

RESOLUTION

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Holt, Nebraska, that the section line extending from the southeast corner of Section 4, Township 28 North, Range 11, West of the 6th P. M. in Holt County, Nebraska, running thence north between Sections 3 and 4 in Township 28, North, Range 11, West of the 6th P. M. in said County and State over and across the right of way of the Chicago & Northwestern Railroad Company and terminating at the south line of right of way line of State and Federal Highways 20 and 275 as now located and here-by is declared an open road as provided by Statute, existing, be and the same the right of way to be 33 feet wide on each side of the section line between said Sections 3 and 4.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that November 1st, 1949, at two o'clock P. M. the County Board of Holt County met in special session to receive,

hear and adjust and allow claims for damage for the taking of property for the establishment of said road, at which time all property owners and persons interested may appear and be heard concerning claims for damages on account of the establishment of said road.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chicago and Northwestern Railroad Company be advised of the action of the Board and the time for filing claims in this matter by service of a copy of this Resolution upon the managing agent of said railroad at O'Neill, Nebraska.

Holt County Board of Supervisors met in special session at this time to confirm sale of the County lots and transact other business. All members present.

Meeting called to order by the Chairman.

At the close of the Sale the Board discussed the matter of confirming the sale. Motion was then made by Borg, seconded by Hubbard that the Sale of Lots 1, 2 & 3, Block 13, original town of O'Neill to W. B. Gillespie for the sum of \$2325.00 be confirmed, and that the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors and the County Clerk be authorized to furnish him a deed to this property. Motion carried.

2:00 P. M. This was the time set for hearing and adjusting Claims for damages on the road to be opened by the Van Horn petition. A damage claim was reviewed from the Chicago and Northwestern Railway Company in the amount of \$240.00.

Mrs. Hansen appeared before the Board and put in a damage claim for \$800.00. There seems to be some doubt as to whether part of this road has been opened before, a decision was postponed until after further investigation.

Bids on a 3/4 ton pickup which the County is going to purchase were opened at this time. Ten bids were received. After a careful review of all of the bids, motion was made by Cronk, seconded by Hubbard, that since considering all things the Midwest Motor Co., Ltd., of O'Neill, Nebr. has the lowest bid on the type of truck wanted, we accept their bid and purchase a Chevrolet pickup from them. Motion carried.

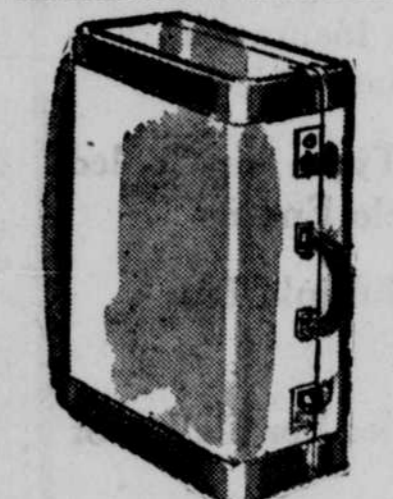

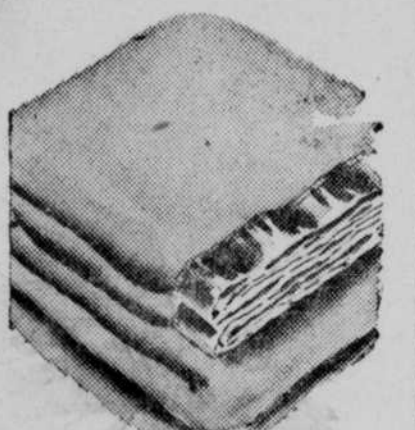
