Tree Planting Machine Operates Successfully
 "Trees planted with the tree planting machine last spring show a high survival and plantings have been successful," according to the Supervisors of the Holt Soil Conservation District. The trees were planted with the District Supervisors tree planting machines on farms co-operating with the district and a survival survey shows a high percentage of survival. Some species started better than others but practically all plantings have made a satisfactory start.
 "This practice of planting trees with the machine will be continued next year," the supervisors stated. It should be pointed out that this can be done only on farms where the farmer is co-operating with the District.
 All orders for trees from the District must be placed before December 31, since this is the final date on which the District Supervisors can revise their order. The first requests received will have first chance at the trees should a shortage develop of some species so it is advisable to make the necessary arrangements now.

AAA News Notes
 Dairy Subsidy Payment: August 31st is the deadline date for filing applications for the payment of April, May and June dairy products sales. If you have not sent your sales receipts in—do so now and be assured of receiving this payment. Remember the deadline—August 31, 1945.
 Federal Crop Insurance: Applications are now being taken for insuring your crop against winter-kill, hail, wind, rain, insects, plant disease and frost. Contracts are being written by AAA Committeemen and a sales agent. If you are interested in insuring your wheat crop—contact the committee or County Office and ask them to explain all the details of this insurance. The deadline date for filing an insurance contract is August 31, or the date of seeding, whichever date is earlier. Be sure Insure.
 Farmers Cautioned On Sheep, Lamb Subsidy: It's up to farmers who sell their sheep and lambs to buyers other than legally authorized slaughterers to protect themselves so that the prices they receive will reflect the subsidy payment under the Government's sheep and lamb production payment program.
 Under the new program, CCC payments will go to persons who sell sheep and lambs to a legally authorized slaughterer for slaughter. The last person who owns the animals is entitled to the subsidy. Further details will be issued as soon as received.
