Marks Leyte Landing





A-La-Kangaroo Pack




New Zealand war brides to arrive recently at Los Angeles, is demon strating her A-La-Kangaroe carrier for six-months-old baby Wayne.

The hydrophone picks up the sound thrown off by the U-boats and relays it by cable to the radio transmitter in the top compartment which broadcasts the signal to waiting ships and planes.

Heads Atomic Group




