Holt County Board of Supervisors met as per adjournment. All members present. Meeting called to order by the Chairman.

Minutes of the previous meeting read and approved as read. The Finance Committee reported as follows: We, your Finance Committee, beg to report that all fees for the month of January, from the various offices, have been remitted to the County Treasurer as required by law.

WHEREAS, by virtue of Legislative Bill No. 351 of the 58th Session of the Nebraska State Legislature, the various County Boards of the State were authorized to appropriate and pay such sums of money as they might deem necessary out of the general fund of such counties, to the County Veterans' Coordinating Committee designated and certified by the State Committee of the same name, for the purpose of carrying on the statutory functions of such committee, and

WHEREAS, the Veterans' Service Coordinating Committee of the State of Nebraska has designated and certified a Veterans' Service Coordinating Committee for Holt County, and,

WHEREAS no provisions or appropriation for such committee was contained in the regular budget for this county for the present fiscal year, and the need therefor was unanticipated at the time of preparing such budget, and

WHEREAS, the purposes of Section 6 of said Legislative Bill No. 351 are for the public safety, the public welfare, and the public health, and an emergency with respect thereto is found to exist and so declared,

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Holt County, Nebraska, that there is hereby appropriated from the General Fund of said county the sum of \$800.00

for the purpose of financing the Veterans' Service Coordinating Committee of Holt County until July 1, 1946, and the Treasurer of said county is hereby directed to so establish fund.

Motion by Collins, seconded by Schollmeyer, that the above resolution be adopted. Carried.

RESOLUTION WHEREAS, Elizabeth Harkins, Guardian of Salona Harkins, as incompetent, duly appointed by the County Court of Holt county, Nebraska, has filed in the District Court of the county of Holt, her petition and application for license to sell the following described interest in real estate belonging to said incompetent, to-wit:
