Skillful Darn

A skillful darn is the disguise for small holes, snags, or worn places in wool clothes. Defective Trees Trees which have even a little internal decay are greatly reduced in their value for sawtimber. Foresters explain that nearly all of the decay in trees is produced by fungi, transmitted by spores which are carried by the wind. Tree bark protects the trees against these spores, but when it is broken these wood-rotting fungi are permitted to enter the tree and get established. They offer four suggestions to prevent excessive loss from decay in trees: Harvest defective trees be- ings and equipment. fore decay makes them useless; do not allow livestock to graze in the woods; keep fire out of the woods; and avoid injuring the standing need of driving some 75 to 200 trees during logging operations.
